Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 38-2202 is hereby amended to read as follows: 38-2202. As used in the revised Kansas code for care of children, unless the context otherwise indicates:

- (a) "Abandon" or "abandonment" means to forsake, desert or, without making appropriate provision for substitute care, cease providing care for the child.
- (b) "Adult correction facility" means any public or private facility,
 secure or nonsecure, that is used for the lawful custody of accused or
 convicted adult criminal offenders.
- (c) "Aggravated circumstances" means the abandonment, torture, chronic abuse, sexual abuse or chronic,—life threatening life-threatening neglect of a child.

- (d) "Child in need of care" means a person less than 18 years of age at the time of filing of the petition or issuance of an ex parte protective custody order pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2242, and amendments thereto, who:
- (1) Is without adequate parental care, control or subsistence and the condition is not due solely to the lack of financial means of the child's parents or other custodian;
- (2) is without the care or control necessary for the child's physical mental or emotional health;
- (3) has been physically, mentally or emotionally abused or neglected or sexually abused;

- (4) has been placed for care or adoption in violation of law;
- (5) has been abandoned or does not have a known living parent;
- (6) is not attending school as required by K.S.A. 72-3421 or 72-3120, and amendments thereto;
- (7) except in the case of a violation of K.S.A. 41-727, K.S.A. 74-8810(j), K.S.A. or 79-3321(m) or (n), and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 21-6301(a)(14), and amendments thereto, or, except as

New Section 1. (a) Upon a written request of an eligible young adult, the secretary for children and families shall provide reentry services to such young adult.

- (b) Young adults are eligible for reentry services if such young adult:
- (1) Has reached 18 years of age but not yet 21 years of age;
- (2) was previously in custody of the secretary and in an outof-home placement on or after such young adult has reached 16 years of age; and
- (3) such out-of-home placement was not with such young adult's parents, at a juvenile detention facility or a juvenile correctional facility.
- (c) Such young adult receiving reentry services shall participate in self-sufficiency planning, attend school or work and make efforts towards independence as determined by the secretary.
- (d) Provision of reentry services shall terminate when, whichever of the following occurs first:
- (1) The secretary determines the young adult is not complying with subsection (c);
- (2) the young adult voluntarily requests termination of services; or
- (3) the young adult reaches 21 years of age.
