AN ACT concerning cemeteries; authorizing the disorganization of the Clearwater cemetery district; conveying certain real property and transferring assets and other property of such district.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The board of trustees of the Clearwater cemetery district located in Sedgwick county is authorized to disorganize such cemetery district by adoption of a resolution of disorganization. Such resolution shall be adopted by a unanimous vote of the trustees and shall include a plan of disorganization. The plan of disorganization shall provide for the transfer of all property of such district, including any real property and improvements thereon, any permanent maintenance fund and all other moneys, investments and assets, to the city of Clearwater, the Ninnescah township and the Ohio township, all located in Sedgwick county.

- (b) Upon the conveyance of the cemetery district's real property pursuant to subsection (a), title to that property located within the boundaries of each of the city of Clearwater, the Ninnescah township and the Ohio township shall vest in such municipality, respectively, in accordance with the plan of disorganization.
- (c) The cemetery district's permanent maintenance fund, if any, together with any investments then outstanding, and all books, records, papers and other property of such district shall be transferred to the treasurers of the city of Clearwater, the Ninnescah township and the Ohio township in accordance with the plan of disorganization.
- Upon the transfer of all property pursuant to this section, the governing body of each municipality receiving any portion of such property shall care for and maintain those cemetery plots located within such municipality's boundaries. Such care and maintenance shall be paid for from any moneys or other property received by such municipality pursuant to the plan of disorganization, including, but not limited to, the principal and income from any permanent maintenance fund. If such moneys and property are insufficient to properly care for and maintain such cemetery plots, then such municipality shall use the funds of such municipality for such care and maintenance. The principal and income from any permanent maintenance fund received by a municipality pursuant
- to the plan of disorganization may be deposited in any appropriate fund of

4 5 such municipality or invested in accordance with K.S.A. 17-1311, and amendments thereto, but shall be used exclusively for the care and maintenance of such cemetery plots.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
