Chair Colloton, Vice-Chair Kinzer, Ranking MemberMcCary-Miller and Honored Members:

Thank you, as always, for the opportunity to appear before your Committee to share information about our work at the Juvenile Justice Authority – particularly about the on-going efforts to create separation between Juvenile Offender youth assigned to JJA custody from the Child In Need of Care (CINC) youth populations ordered into SRS custody.

This has been an on-going process with the underlying goal of creating a physical separation in out-of-home placements between the JJA and SRS custodial populations. As we have often discussed, a driving belief is that it might be detrimental — on many levels — to unnecessarily expose low- and norisk youth to youth with a higher offender risk or profile. Adjudication offers a fairly bright line of separation. Brad Burke, JJA's Chief Counsel prepared and submitted a brief discussing the legal background of the reasons for the separation process. The brief was presented to the interim committee. Copies can be made available. Suffice it to say that safety of populations and providers is also a key concern.

Since the initial discussions between the Juvenile Justice Authority (JJA) and Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS) regarding the separation of youth in JJA custody and youth in SRS custody in out-of-home placements, the process has continued towards the primary goal of establishing safer environments in out-of-home placements by eliminating the intermingling of juvenile offenders with non-offending CINC youth. In addition to this primary goal, both agencies are working together to optimize the proximity of youth placements to their home communities as a secondary goal, and to give due consideration to the stability of current system providers as the tertiary outcome.

The initiative was reviewed for the Interim Oversight Committee in September. Since then, staff from JJA and SRS have met several times to discuss the initiative and steps required to move it forward

successfully. Toward that end, the agencies hosted a meeting with all providers in early October. The purpose of that meeting was to answer questions and obtain the input from the providers regarding their concerns for implementation and policy consideration as the separation process moves forward.

Currently, JJA and SRS staff are working together to develop an initial draft placement model for three of the primary residential placement types: Youth Residential Centers (YRC II), Transitional Living Program (TLP), and Emergency Shelters (ES). The purpose of the model is to provide a framework to review and discuss with providers in a meeting tentatively planned to occur in late February or early March. With this input from providers, a final model and implementation plan will be developed.

At a hearing of the interim committee, JJA and SRS provided a jointly prepared study representing a geographic snapshot of provider capacity paired against agency utilization. A copy of that study is attached.




