

**Testimony before the Kansas House of Representatives Committee on  
Government Efficiencies on HB 2677**

Mr. Chairman: It is a privilege and an honor to address the Committee on Government Efficiencies today regarding HB 2677. HB 2677 is the result of Governor Brownback's initiative to repeal outmoded, unreasonable, duplicative, onerous or unduly burdensome statutes and regulations. HB 2677 encompasses a statutory amendment that falls within the category of being unreasonable.

The portion of K.S.A. 19-430 that HB 2677 removes from the statute is as follows:

County appraisers appointed in counties having a population of more than 25,000 shall devote full time to the duties of such office but county appraisers appointed in counties having a population of 25,000 or less may be appointed either as a full-time or a part-time county appraiser as prescribed in the resolution providing for such appointment.

The Office of the Repealer urges favorable consideration of HB 2677.
