

Emergency Preparedness Planning Wayne Penrod, Executive Manager, Environmental Policy October 17, 2011

- Sunflower and Mid-Kansas are wholesale providers for six rural electric cooperatives that serve retail member-owners in central and western Kansas.
- We have mandated emergency operations responsibilities through NERC/FERC/SPP
 - EOP-001 Emergency Operations Plan (overarching procedure describing the set of EOP plans that are followed to mitigate operating emergencies).
 - EOP-002 Capacity and Energy Emergency Plan and associated Step Process (this has had multiple iterations per our lessons learned on our EEAs)
 - EOP-003 Load Shedding Plan
 - EOP-004 Disturbance Reporting Procedure (describes process by which we report disturbances or occurrences on our system that impact the operation of the Bulk Electric System).
 - EOP-008 Loss of Main Control Center Plan
- We also have Rural Utility Service Emergency Response Planning responsibilities
- That we will coordinate with KDEM during disasters and will communicate with KDEM directly or with electric cooperative delegate to Emergency Operations Center through the Kansas Electric Cooperatives.
