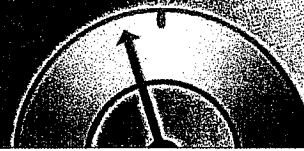

The Kansas Health Matters website, www.kansashealthmatters.org, contains county, regional and state health indicators. In addition, the site provides tools and resources for community health assessment and community health improvement efforts.

The website is designed to help hospitals, health departments, policymakers, community planners and members learn about issues, identify improvements and collaborate for positive change. Kansas Health Matters also builds on an effort to help hospitals and health departments with community health needs assessments and improvement plans.

Kansas Health Matters website users can:

- Compare their county's health with other Kansas counties, the nation and 2020 targets;
- Create reports in the report assistant;
- Learn about promising practices on a variety of topics that affect community health;
- Access tools and resources in the CHNA toolbox; and
- Upload local reports or ask local questions with the Ask the Expert feature.

Data is provided for Kansas Public Health Regions, so users can click on their county's region to see local information. The website also features resources in eight topic centers: health, economy, environment, public safety, transportation, education, government and politics, and social environment.

What is this Indicator?

This indicator shows the percentage of adults (ages 18 and older) who are obese based on the Body Mass Index (BMI). The BMI is calculated by taking a person's weight and dividing it by their height squared in metric units. (BMI = Weight (Kg) / (Height (cm) ^ 2)) A BMI ≥ 30 is considered obese.

Why this is important: The obesity is an indicator of the overall health and lifestyle of a community. Obesity increases the risk of many diseases and health conditions including heart disease, Type 2 diabetes, cancer, hypertension, stroke, liver and gallbladder disease, respiratory problems, and osteoarthritis. Losing weight and maintaining a healthy weight help to prevent and control these diseases. Obesity leads to significant economic costs due to increased healthcare spending and lost earnings. The Healthy People 2020 national health target is to reduce the proportion of adults (ages 20 and up) who are obese to 30.6%.

Technical Note: The Kansas State value is compared to the United States value. Confidence intervals were not taken into account while making this comparison.

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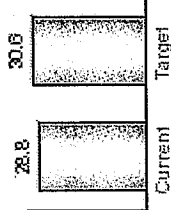

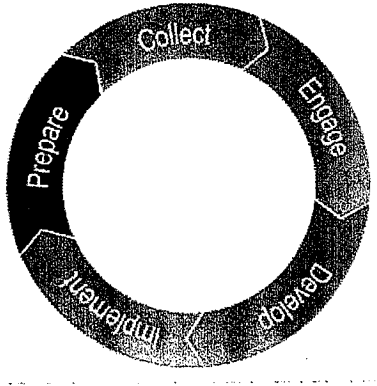
Preparing for Community Health Needs Assessment

Before you embark upon a Community Health Needs Assessment, it's helpful to know who is on this journey with you. Establish a Community Health Needs Assessment Team.

Conducting a community health needs assessment and developing an implementation strategy are good opportunities to initiate or strengthen relationships within the communities you serve. Engaging the community will not only improve your assessment and implementation strategies, it can lead to successful collaborations for addressing community health needs.

The Kansas Partnership for Improving Community Health created the Who Should Collaborate List to get you started.

It will be important for your Community Health Needs Assessment Team to form consensus on mission, goals, roles, actions and a timeline. Your team will want to identify (and then secure) needed resources as well as develop a budget.

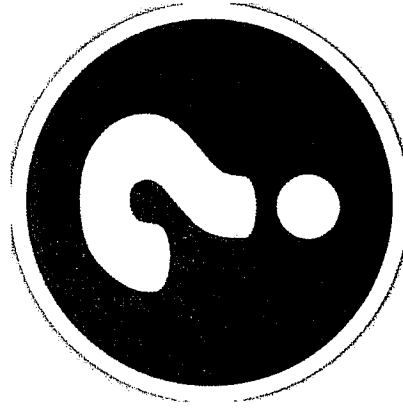
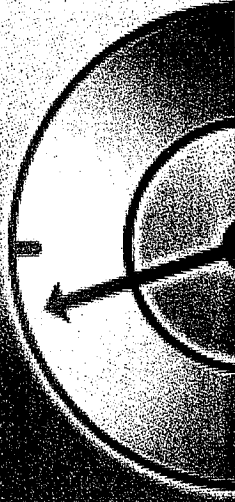
