SB 11 -Authorizing transportation of students residing on Fort Leavenworth military reservation

Chairman Aurand opened the hearing on **<u>SB 11</u>**.

Eunice Peters, Office of the Revisor of Statutes explained **<u>SB 11</u>** to the committee.

A question and answer session followed.

Jack E. Walker, Deputy to the Garrison Commander, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, spoke to the committee as a proponent on <u>SB 11</u>. The passage of this bill is of great importance to the high school children of Fort Leavenworth as it will allow funding to be provided to Unified School District 207, which, in turn, will allow them to bus our Fort Leavenworth 10th through 12th grade students to Leavenworth high School in Unified School District 453. Unified School District 207 is a Kansas School District rather than a Department of Defense School. Kansas Statutes do not allow a high school to be operated within USD 207, which operates wholly on Fort Leavenworth. <u>(Attachment 1)</u>
