<u>Senator Kelsey moved to introduce SB 341-cities; dissolution because of environmental buyout.</u> The <u>motion was seconded by Senator Marshall. The motion passed.</u>

Representative Doug Gatewood presented background on <u>SB 341</u>. In the 2007 Session, the Kansas Legislature created a "Trust" that was charged with providing relocation opportunities, voluntary, not mandatory, for the citizens in Treece, Kansas. The Trust has paid all debts of the city and holds title to the city property as well as the residential properties. (<u>attachment 1</u>) In order to transfer real estate owned by the city, the city must be dissolved. This will allow the Trust to complete their duties, transfer the properties, and end their mission. Senator Dwayne Umberger, (<u>attachment 2</u>) and Nicole Proulx Aiken, Staff Attorney, League of Kansas Municipalities, (<u>attachment 3</u>) both gave testimony in support of the bill.

The hearing was closed.

<u>Senator Marshall moved to introduce SB 329–Historic properties; projects within environs; city opt out of state historic preservation officer review.</u> The motion was seconded by Senator Kelsey. The motion carried.

Sandy Jacquot, Director of Law/General Counsel, League of Kansas Municipalities, spoke in favor of **SB 329.** She explained the bill would allow cities to adopt an ordinance, after a public hearing, exempting itself from the requirements of K.S.A. 75-2724, but it must make a provision for standards to protect historic property in the city. It must also make a finding that the state review process will have a detrimental effect on the economic development of the city. (attachment 4) Luke Bell, Vice President of Governmental Affairs, Kansas Association of Realtors, (attachment 5), J.D. Lester, City Manager, Chanute, Kansas, (attachment 6), and Ken Matney, Business Owner, Chanute, Kansas, (attachment 7) all gave testimony supporting the bill. Ed Bideau, Attorney, Chanute, Kansas, (attachment 8) presented testimony supporting the bill with suggested amendments. Christy Davis, Kansas P reservation Alliance (on behalf of Linda Glasgow) presented testimony in opposition to **SB 329**. The Kansas Preservation Alliance opposes **SB 329** because they believe that the intent of the proposed amendments is already achieved in the current statute. (attachment 9)

Patrick Zoller, Director, Cultural Resources Division, Kansas State Historical Society, (on behalf of Jennie Chinn) spoke as a neutral party and provided background and data concerning The Kansas Preservation Act. He noted that the current law already provides for everything the SB 329 intends to do:

Local governing authority has the final determination in a state law review. Local governments can conduct their own state law review. (attachment 10)

The hearing was closed.
