Introduction of Resolutions

At the request of the Chairperson, Daniel Yoza, Office of the Revisor of Statutes, provided a brief summary of "A RESOLUTION concerning transportation; requesting a multi-year federal transportation funding program at current funding levels." <u>Senator Huntington made</u> <u>a motion to introduce the resolution and Senator Reitz seconded</u>. Senator Donovan and Senator Reitz expressed concerns with issues facing the federal government regarding the funding to the individual states. A voice vote was called and the motion carried.

Daniel Yoza, Office of the Revisor of Statutes, at the request of the Chairperson provided some background on "A RESOLUTION urging congress to amend the federal highway beautification act to allow businesses in small towns across Kansas to advertise with outdoor highway advertising signs." <u>Senator Schmidt made a motion to introduce the resolution and</u> <u>Senator Reitz seconded</u>. <u>A voice vote was called and the motion carried</u>.

Discussion on highway advertising

The Chairperson stated that the Committee had heard testimony on this issue previously; however, the Committee tabled **SB151—Highway advertising; permitting spot zoning** due to possible loss of federal funding. The resolution introduced is intended to promote changes in the Federal Highway Beautification Act that may allow small town businesses to advertise on outdoor signage along highways.
