the signage that would be permitted under the bill would not be in compliance with federal regulations; however, KDOT believes the federal government would issue a warning prior to any money being withheld and at that point any sign erected under the bill would need to be removed. The Chairperson stated he would entertain a motion to work the bill. <u>Senator Marshall made a motion to pass SB 151 favorably for passage</u>. <u>Senator Reitz seconded the motion, and the motion carried on a voice vote</u>.
