## Possible final action on **SB 444--Relating to employment of disabled individuals and competitive bids for state contracts**

Chairperson McGinn summarized the previous hearing (March 9, 2012) on **SB 444** and the committee's subsequent deliberations on May 4, 7, 8, and 9, 2012. Senator McGinn noted that a balloon drafted by the Office of the Revisor of Statutes was adopted on May 8; however, final action on the bill was not taken. Senator Teichman moved favorable passage of SB 444, as amended; Senator Schmidt seconded the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

Senator Schmidt summarized <u>Senate Substitute for SB 459</u>, which created the joint KanCare Oversight Committee and passed out of Senate Ways and Means on March 21, 2012. Senator Schmidt indicated <u>HB 2619</u>, currently in Senate Ways and Means, is a shell that related to the licensure of adult care homes and whose contents were placed in another bill during the 2012 Session. It was suggested to delete the contents of <u>HB 2619</u> and to insert contents of <u>S Sub for SB 459</u>. SenatorSchmidt moved to delete any contents of <u>HB 2619</u> and to insert the contents of <u>S Sub for SB 459</u> and to pass out favorably Senate Substitute for HB 2619; Senator Huntington seconded the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:23 a.m.
