SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 118 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 118 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 118 would increase the statutory maximum limit for the following Board of Barbering fees:

The bill would include two new fees. The first is for the issuance of a new chair lease license or annual renewal at \$50 and for the restoration of an expired chair lease license, if the expiration period is under three years at \$50.

The Board of Barbering indicates it does not plan to increase fees in FY 2012 or FY 2013, so there would be no fiscal effect to the Board in either of those fiscal years. The Board indicates the increases in the statutory maximum limit for fees is for long range planning, should the Board ever need to increase fees. Currently, the Board is at the statutory maximum in all of the fees SB 118 would increase. The last time the Legislature increased the statutory maximum was in 2003 and the last time the Board raised fees was in 2007. The two additional fees for

chair leases and renewals are currently being charged by the Board at \$25. SB 118 would put the two additional fees into statute and the Board has indicated it will continue to charge \$25 for both fees. Currently, the leasing of chair licenses and renewals are mentioned in the *Kansas Administrative Regulations* 61-4-2.
