SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 343 by Senate Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 343 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 343 would allow private detectives to equip a motor vehicle with one-way glass or any sun screening device used in conjunction with windshields, side wings, side windows, or rear windows. The private detective would be required to have a current Kansas private detective's license and would be required to be in the course of doing private detective business to use this equipment.

The Kansas Bureau of Investigation, which licenses private detectives in Kansas, states passage of SB 343 would have no fiscal effect on agency operations.
