AN ACT concerning state institutions and state agencies; establishing the
 joint committee on oversight of the closure of the Kansas neurological
 institute; Kansas neurological institute community conversion
 conservation fund.

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6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

7 Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the joint committee on oversight of the closure of the Kansas neurological institute. The joint 8 9 committee shall review the number of individuals who are transferred 10 from the Kansas neurological institute to home and community based 11 services and the associated cost savings and other outcomes of the money-12 follows-the-person program. The joint committee shall review the data and 13 information submitted by the Kansas facilities closure and realignment 14 commission regarding community placement costs, proposed costs incurred by the Kansas neurological institute transition of Kansas 15 16 neurological institute residents to the community and projected savings in 17 the closure of the Kansas neurological institute. The joint committee may 18 consider other data or information that the joint committee deems 19 necessary to review in the joint committee's oversight of the closure of the 20 Kansas neurological institute.

(b) No additional individuals shall be added to the home and
 community based services developmental disability medicaid waiver until
 the secretary of social and rehabilitation services provides to the joint
 committee the following information:

(1) The number of individuals currently receiving services under the
home and community based services developmental disability medicaid
waiver based upon the individual's score on the developmental disability
profile assessment and the level of reimbursement tier that such individual
qualifies for;

(2) the number of individuals waiting to receive services under the
home and community based services developmental disability medicaid
waiver based upon the individual's score on the developmental disability
profile assessment and the level of reimbursement tier that such individual
qualifies for;

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(3) a report of the estimated funding cost over a ten-year period for

providing services for individuals currently receiving services and those
 waiting to receive services under the home and community based services
 developmental disability medicaid waiver pursuant to subsections (b)(1)
 and (b)(2); and

5 (4) a report of the estimated funding cost over a ten-year period for 6 providing services for individuals currently residing at the Kansas 7 neurological institute and who are transferred to receive services under the 8 home and community based services medicaid waiver.

9 The information in this subsection shall be provided by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services to the members of the joint committee 10 prior to the first meeting of the joint committee. The provisions of this 11 subsection shall not apply to individuals who are determined by the 12 13 secretary of social and rehabilitation services to be in crisis, individuals who have been in the custody of the state in the foster care program or 14 individuals transferred from the Kansas neurological institute to receive 15 16 services under the home and community based services developmental 17 disability medicaid waiver.

(c) The joint committee shall consist of seven members as follows:

(1) One member of the house of representatives appointed by thespeaker of the house of representatives;

(2) one member of the house of representatives appointed by theminority leader of the house of representatives;

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(3) one member of the senate appointed by the president of the senate;

24 (4) one member of the senate appointed by the minority leader of the25 senate;

(5) one member of the house of representatives appointed by themajority leader of the house of representatives; and

(6) two members appointed by the governor, one of which shall be a
current or former employee of the Kansas neurological institute and the
other a parent or legal guardian of a current resident of the Kansas
neurological institute.

32 (d) Legislative members shall be appointed for terms coinciding with 33 the legislative terms for which such members are elected or appointed. All 34 legislative members appointed to fill vacancies in the membership of the joint committee and all members appointed to succeed such members 35 appointed to membership of the joint committee shall be appointed in the 36 37 manner provided for the original appointment of the legislative members 38 succeeded. Members appointed by the governor shall serve terms of two 39 vears.

40 (e) All members originally appointed as members of the joint
41 committee shall meet upon the call of the member appointed by the
42 speaker of the house of representatives, who shall be the first chairperson,
43 within 30 days of the effective date of this act. The vice-chairperson of the

joint committee shall be appointed by the president of the senate. The chairperson and the vice-chairperson shall alternate annually between the members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate. The ranking minority member shall be from the same chamber as the chairperson. The joint committee shall meet at least two times each year at the call of the chairperson of the joint committee. The first meeting of the joint committee shall be held before October 1,

8 2011. Four members of the joint committee constitute a quorum.

9 (f) At the beginning of each regular session of the legislature, the 10 committee shall submit to the president of the senate and the speaker of the 11 house of representatives:

(1) A written report on numbers of individuals transferred from the
 Kansas neurological institute to the home and community based services
 including the average daily census in the state institutions and long-term
 care facilities;

16 (2) savings resulting from the transfer certified by the secretary of 17 social and rehabilitation services;

(3) the current balance in the Kansas neurological institute
 community conversion conservation fund of the department of social and
 rehabilitation services; and

(4) a written report on the joint committee's evaluation of the
 information provided by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services
 pursuant to subsection (b).

(g) (1) Legislative members of the committee shall be paid
compensation, travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allowance as
provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto, for attendance at
any meeting of the joint committee or any subcommittee meeting
authorized by the committee.

(2) Members appointed by the governor attending meetings of the
joint committee, or attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized
by such joint committee, shall be paid compensation, subsistence
allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in subsections (a) and
(d), inclusive, of K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.

34 Sec. 2. (a) (1) There is hereby established the Kansas neurological 35 institute community conversion conservation fund in the state treasury 36 which shall be administered by the secretary of social and rehabilitation 37 services. All savings resulting from transferring individuals from the 38 Kansas neurological institute to home and community based services shall 39 be credited to the Kansas neurological institute community conversion 40 conservation fund. All expenditures from the Kansas neurological institute 41 community conversion conservation fund shall be in accordance with the 42 provisions of appropriation acts upon vouchers approved by the secretary 43 of social and rehabilitation services or the secretary's designee.

1 (2) Whenever an individual who is residing in the Kansas 2 neurological institute transfers to home and community based services, the 3 secretary of social and rehabilitation services shall determine the savings 4 attributable to such transfer and shall certify the amount or amounts of 5 such savings to the director of accounts and reports. The secretary shall 6 consider, but is not limited to, the following in the determination of 7 savings:

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(A) The Kansas neurological institute building closure costs;

9 (B) the cost of providing supertier reimbursement expenditures made 10 for Kansas neurological institute residents receiving services under the 11 home and community based services developmental disability medicaid 12 waiver;

13 (C) the cost of basic facility maintenance at the Kansas neurological14 institute; and

15 (D) the cost to increase the available capacity for community 16 placement.

17 (b) The secretary shall certify to the joint committee on oversight of 18 the closure of the Kansas neurological institute at the beginning of each 19 calendar quarter the amount of savings resulting from the transfer of 20 individuals from the Kansas neurological institute to home and community 21 based services that have been transferred during the preceding calendar 22 quarter to the Kansas neurological institute community conversion 23 conservation fund during the preceding quarter.

(c) If any provision of this section is repealed or becomes null and
void and has no further force and effect, all moneys in the Kansas
neurological institute community conversion conservation fund, which
were paid under the provisions of this section, shall be returned to and
expended for the home and community based services developmental
disability medicaid waiver.

(d) On and after the closure of the Kansas neurological institute, all
moneys in the Kansas neurological institute community conversion
conservation fund, which were credited to such fund under the provisions
of this section, shall be returned to the list of individuals waiting to receive
services under the home and community based services developmental
disability medicaid waiver.

36 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 37 publication in the statute book.

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
