AN ACT establishing the Kansas employment first initiative act and creating the Kansas employment first oversight commission and creating the Kansas employment first oversight commission.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. (a) This act shall be known as and cited as the Kansas 7 employment first initiative act. *As used in this act:*

8 (1) "Competitive employment" means work in the competitive labor 9 market that is performed on a full-time or part-time basis in an 10 integrated setting; and for which an individual is compensated at or 11 above the minimum wage, but not less than the customary wage and 12 level of benefits paid by the employer for the same or similar work 13 performed by individuals who are not disabled.

14 (2) "Integrated setting" means with respect to an employment 15 outcome, a setting typically found in the community in which applicants 16 or eligible individuals interact with non-disabled individuals, other than 17 non-disabled individuals who are providing services to those applicants 18 or eligible individuals, to the same extent that non-disabled individuals n 19 comparable positions interact with other persons.

20 (b) It is hereby declared to be the policy of the state of Kansas that competitive and integrated employment shall be considered its first option 21 when serving persons with disabilities who are of working age to obtain 22 23 employment for state employment and for those entities that contract with state agencies to provide employment for persons with a disability. This 24 25 policy applies to programs and services that support the employment of 26 provide services and support to help obtain employment for persons 27 with disabilities. All state agencies shall follow this policy and ensure that 28 it is effectively implemented in their programs and services. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any employer to give 29 30 preference to hiring people with a disability.

31 Sec. 2. (a) All state agencies shall coordinate efforts and shall 32 collaborate within and among such agencies to ensure that state programs, policies, procedures and funding support competitive and integrated
 employment of individuals with disabilities. All state agencies shall,
 whenever feasible, share data and information across systems in order to
 track progress toward full implementation of the act.
 (b) State agencies are authorized to adopt rules and regulations to
 implement this act.

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Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby established a Kansas employment first
 oversight commission consisting of five members. The commission shall
 consist of the following members who shall serve for a two-year term:

10 (1) Four members who are persons with a disability or who are
 11 knowledgeable of disability issues and who are not state employees, of 12 whom:

13 (A) One shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;

(B) one shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of
 representatives;

17 (C) one shall be appointed by the president of the senate; and

18 (D) one shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate;

19 (2) one member who is experienced with employment service 20 programs and who is not a state employee shall be appointed by the 21 governor.

(b) The governor shall designate one member to convene and organize the first meeting of the commission at which the commission
 shall elect a chairperson and a vice-chairperson from among its members.
 The commission shall meet at least four times a year and, additionally,
 whenever called by the chairperson. A quorum shall consist of three members. All actions of the commission shall be taken by a majority of the
 members of the commission.

29 (c) Each member of the commission shall be paid mileage and other
 30 expenses as provided by K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto.

31 (d) The commission shall establish measurable goals and objectives 32 for the state of Kansas to ensure implementation of this act. (a) 5 The governor shall designate one cabinet agency as the lead agency member to establish measurable goals and objectives for the state of 6 7 Kansas to ensure implementation of this act. Such lead agency shall track the measurable progress of public agencies in implementing this 8 9 act. All state agencies shall fully cooperate with and provide data and 10 information necessary to assist the lead agency in carrying out its-11 duties. 12 (b) The lead agency designated by the governor shall issue anannual report on or before January 30 each year which shall be 13 presented to the governor and to the chairperson of each of the senate 14 15 committee on ways and means and the house committee on_ 16 appropriations. The report shall detail progress toward the goals and objectives and full implementation of this act. The report also shall 17 18 identify barriers to achieving the outcomes along with the effective-19 strategies and policies that can help realize the employment first 20 initiative. The lead agency shall be responsible for compiling data and 21 coordinating the preparation of the annual report. All state agencies 22 shall cooperate with the lead agency on the creation and dissemination of the annual report. (a) There is hereby established a Kansas 23 24 employment first oversight commission consisting of five members. (f) The governor shall select from the cabinet agencies the lead agency responsible for compiling data and coordinating the preparation of the annual report at the direction of the commission. The activities of the commission and lead agency pursuant to this section shall be done within existing grants and resources.
