1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to
2	extend equal benefits for the treatment of Agent Orange exposure to
3	Vietnam veterans who served outside of Vietnam.
4	WHEREAS, Thousands of veterans of the Vietnam War suffer from the
5	effects of exposure to Agent Orange, a powerful and toxic defoliant used
6	to clear areas of dense vegetation used as enemy hideouts; and
7	WHEREAS, Agent Orange exposure causes a variety of devastating
8	health effects, such as increased rates of cancer, immune system
9	disorders and genetic maladies which lead to birth defects in the children
10	of those exposed; and
11	WHEREAS, Although the use of Agent Orange is most commonly
12	associated with the country of Vietnam, it was also used extensively in
13	surrounding areas such as Thailand; and
14	WHEREAS, Many veterans affected by exposure to Agent Orange
15	proudly and bravely served their country in these surrounding areas
16	without ever actually setting foot in Vietnam itself; and
17	WHEREAS, These veterans are struggling to obtain the same medical
18	benefits to deal with their exposure as those who served on the ground in
19	Vietnam: Now, therefore,
20	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas,
21	the Senate concurring therein: That the Congress of the United States is
22	urged to work with the Department of Veterans Affairs to ensure that
23	Vietnam veterans who served in areas surrounding Vietnam itself are able
24	to receive the same medical benefits for the treatment of Agent Orange
25	exposure as those who served within the country's borders; and
26	Be it further resolved: That the Chief Clerk of the House of
27	Representatives shall send an enrolled copy of this resolution to
28	Representative Fawcett.
