## House Concurrent Resolution No. 5024

1	A RESOLUTION recognizing Lecompton as a Territorial Capital.
2	WHEREAS, The City of Lecompton was recognized as a
3	Territorial Capital of Kansas from 1855 to 1861; and
4	WHEREAS, Presidents Pierce and Buchanan appointed a total of
5	nine Kansas Territorial Governors who subsequently resided in
6	Lecompton; and
7	WHEREAS, There was a free state victory in the territorial
8	election in October of 1857; and
9	WHEREAS, The Lecompton Constitution split the National
10	Democrat Party in 1858, which led to four candidates for President in
11	1860 with Abraham Lincoln as the sole Republican candidate. He won
12	with only 39% of the popular vote; and
13	WHEREAS, The name Lecompton was mentioned at least 55
14	times during the Lincoln-Douglas Presidential debates; and
15	WHEREAS, The Kansas-Nebraska Act proposed the rejection of
16	the Lecompton Constitution by Congress, and a majority of Kansans
17	established that Kansas would not be a slave state; and
18	WHEREAS, The establishment of Kansas as a free state
19	established a tradition of Kansas supporting equal rights for all in the
20	United States and around the world: Now, therefore,
21	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of
22	<i>Kansas</i> : That we recognize and honor Lecompton as a Territorial Capital
23	of Kansas; and
24	Be it further resolved: That the people of Kansas and its elected
25	leaders celebrate 150 years of Kansans supporting equal rights, political
26	freedom, and religious freedom for all people; and
27	Be it further resolved: That the Chief Clerk of the House of
28	Representatives provide an enrolled copy of this resolution to Speaker of
29	the House, Representative Mike O'Neal, Minority Leader, Paul Davis,
30	and the Lecompton Historical Society.
