## House Substitute for SENATE BILL No. 216

AN ACT concerning crimes and punishments; relating to smoking; 1 2 amending K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 21-4009 and 21-4010 and repealing the 3 existing sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 21-4009 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 21-4009. As used in K.S.A. 21-4009 through 21-4014, and 8 amendments thereto:

9 (a) "Access point" means the area within a ten foot radius outside of 10 any doorway, open window or air intake leading into a building or facility 11 that is not exempted pursuant to subsection (d) of K.S.A. 21-4010, and 12 amendments thereto.

13 (b) "Bar" means any indoor area that is operated and licensed for the 14 sale and service of alcoholic beverages, including alcoholic liquor as defined in K.S.A. 41-102, and amendments thereto, or cereal malt 15 beverages as defined in K.S.A. 41-2701, and amendments thereto, for on-16 17 premises consumption.

(c) "Employee" means any person who is employed by an employer 18 19 in consideration for direct or indirect monetary wages or profit, and any 20 person who volunteers their services for a nonprofit entity.

21 (d) "Employer" means any person, partnership, corporation, 22 association or organization, including municipal or nonprofit entities, 23 which employs one or more individual persons.

24 (e) "Enclosed area" means all space between a floor and ceiling 25 which is enclosed on all sides by solid walls, windows or doorways which 26 extend from the floor to the ceiling, including all space therein screened by 27 partitions which do not extend to the ceiling or are not solid or similar structures. For purposes of this section, the following shall not be 28 29 considered an "enclosed area": (1) Rooms or areas, enclosed by walls, windows or doorways, having neither a ceiling nor a roof and which are 30 31 completely open to the elements and weather at all times; and (2) rooms or 32 areas, enclosed by walls, fences, windows or doorways and a roof or 33 ceiling, having openings that are permanently open to the elements and weather and which comprise an area that is at least 30% of the total 34 35 perimeter wall area of such room or area. 36

(f) "Food service establishment" means any place in which food is

1 served or is prepared for sale or service on the premises. Such term shall 2 include, but not be limited to, fixed or mobile restaurants, coffee shops, cafeterias, short-order cafes, luncheonettes, grills, tea rooms, sandwich 3 4 shops, soda fountains, taverns, private clubs, roadside kitchens, commissaries and any other private, public or nonprofit organization or 5 6 institution routinely serving food and any other eating or drinking 7 establishment or operation where food is served or provided for the public 8 with or without charge.

9 (g) "Gaming floor" means the area of a lottery gaming facility orracetrack gaming facility, as those terms are defined in K.S.A. 74-8702, 10 and amendments thereto, where patrons engage in Class III gaming. The 11 12 gaming floor shall not include any areas used for accounting, maintenance, surveillance, security, administrative offices, storage, cash or cash-13 14 counting, records, food service, lodging or entertainment, except that the 15 gaming floor may include a bar where alcoholic beverages are served so 16 long as the bar is located entirely within the area where Class III gaming is 17 conducted

(h) (g) "Medical care facility" means a physician's office, general
 hospital, special hospital, ambulatory surgery center or recuperation center,
 as defined by K.S.A. 65-425, and amendments thereto, and any psychiatric
 hospital licensed under K.S.A. 75-3307b, and amendments thereto.

22 (i) (h) "Outdoor recreational facility" means a hunting, fishing, 23 shooting or golf club, business or enterprise operated primarily for the 24 benefit of its owners, members and their guests and not normally open to 25 the general public.

(i) "Place of employment" means any enclosed area under the 26 27 control of a public or private employer, including, but not limited to, work areas, auditoriums, elevators, private offices, employee lounges and 28 restrooms, conference and meeting rooms, classrooms, employee 29 cafeterias, stairwells and hallways, that is used by employees during the 30 31 course of employment. For purposes of this section, a private residence shall not be considered a "place of employment" unless such residence is 32 33 used as a day care home, as defined in K.S.A. 65-530, and amendments 34 thereto.

35 (k) (j) "Private club" means an outdoor recreational facility operated 36 primarily for the use of its owners, members and their guests that in its 37 ordinary course of business is not open to the general public for which use 38 of its facilities has substantial dues or membership fee requirements for its 39 members.

40 (1) (k) "Public building" means any building owned or operated by:
41 (1) The state, including any branch, department, agency, bureau,
42 commission, authority or other instrumentality thereof; (2) any county,
43 city, township, other political subdivision, including any commission,

authority, agency or instrumentality thereof; or (3) any other separate
 corporate instrumentality or unit of the state or any municipality.

3 (m) (l) "Public meeting" means any meeting open to the public 4 pursuant to K.S.A. 75-4317 et seq., and amendments thereto, or any other 5 law of this state.

6 (m) "Public place" means any enclosed areas open to the public or 7 used by the general public including, but not limited to: Banks, bars, food 8 service establishments, retail service establishments, retail stores, public means of mass transportation, passenger elevators, health care institutions 9 or any other place where health care services are provided to the public, 10 medical care facilities, educational facilities, libraries, courtrooms, public 11 buildings, restrooms, grocery stores, school buses, museums, theaters, 12 auditoriums, arenas and recreational facilities. For purposes of this section, 13 a private residence shall not be considered a "public place" unless such 14 15 residence is used as a day care home, as defined in K.S.A. 65-530, and 16 amendments thereto.

17 (o) (n) "Smoking" means possession of a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe 18 or burning tobacco in any other form or device designed for the use of 19 tobacco.

20 (p) (o) "Tobacco shop" means any indoor area operated primarily for 21 the retail sale of tobacco, tobacco products or smoking devices or 22 accessories, and which derives not less than 65% of its gross receipts from 23 the sale of tobacco.

(q) (p) "Substantial dues or membership fee requirements" means
 initiation costs, dues or fees proportional to the cost of membership in
 similarly-situated outdoor recreational facilities that are not considered
 nominal and implemented to otherwise avoid or evade restrictions of a
 statewide ban on smoking.

29 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 21-4010 is hereby amended to read as 30 follows: 21-4010. (a) No person shall smoke in an enclosed area or at a 31 public meeting including, but not limited to:

(1) Public places;

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(2) taxicabs and limousines;

34 (3) restrooms, lobbies, hallways and other common areas in public
35 and private buildings, condominiums and other multiple-residential
36 facilities;

(4) restrooms, lobbies and other common areas in hotels and motels
and in at least 80% of the sleeping quarters within a hotel or motel that
may be rented to guests;

40 (5) access points of all buildings and facilities not exempted pursuant 41 to subsection (d); and

42 (6) any place of employment.

43 (b) Each employer having a place of employment that is an enclosed

area shall provide a smoke-free workplace for all employees. Such employer shall also adopt and maintain a written smoking policy which shall prohibit smoking without exception in all areas of the place of employment. Such policy shall be communicated to all current employees within one week of its adoption and shall be communicated to all new employees upon hiring. Each employer shall provide a written copy of the smoking policy upon request to any current or prospective employee.

8 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, K.S.A. 21-9 4011 or 21-4012, and amendments thereto, the proprietor or other person 10 in charge of an adult care home, as defined in K.S.A. 39-923, and 11 amendments thereto, or a medical care facility, may designate a portion of 12 such adult care home, or the licensed long-term care unit of such medical 13 care facility, as a smoking area, and smoking may be permitted within such 14 designated smoking area.

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(d) The provisions of this section shall not apply to:

16 (1) The outdoor areas of any building or facility beyond the access17 points of such building or facility;

(2) private homes or residences, except when such home or residence
is used as a day care home, as defined in K.S.A. 65-530, and amendments
thereto;

(3) a hotel or motel room rented to one or more guests if the total
 percentage of such hotel or motel rooms in such hotel or motel does not
 exceed 20%;

(4) the gaming floor of a lottery gaming facility or racetrack gaming
 facility, as those terms are defined in K.S.A. 74-8702, and amendments thereto;

(5) (4) that portion of an adult care home, as defined in K.S.A. 39923, and amendments thereto, that is expressly designated as a smoking
area by the proprietor or other person in charge of such adult care home
pursuant to subsection (c) and that is fully enclosed and ventilated;

(6) (5) that portion of a licensed long-term care unit of a medical care
 facility that is expressly designated as a smoking area by the proprietor or
 other person in charge of such medical care facility pursuant to subsection
 (c) and that is fully enclosed and ventilated and to which access is
 restricted to the residents and their guests;

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(7) (6) tobacco shops;

(8) (7) a class A or class B club defined in K.S.A. 41-2601, and
amendments thereto, which (A) held a license pursuant to K.S.A. 41-2606
et seq., and amendments thereto, as of January 1, 2009; and (B) notifies
the secretary of health and environment in writing, not later than 90 days
after the effective date of this act, that it wishes to continue to allow
smoking on its premises; and

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(9) (8) a private club in designated areas where minors are

1 prohibited-; and

(9) any annual benefit cigar dinner or other annual smoking event 2 conducted specifically and exclusively for charitable purposes by an 3 organization which has held charitable events during the previous three 4 years and is organized not-for-profit and which qualifies under section 5 501(c)(3) of the federal internal revenue code of 1986. 6 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 21-4009 and 21-4010 are hereby repealed. 7

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 8 9 publication in the statute book.

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
