

**SENATE BILL No. 333**

By Committee on Ethics and Elections

1 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to petitions; amending K.S.A.  
2 2011 Supp. 25-205, 25-302a, 25-303, 25-3602, 25-4005, 25-4306, 25-  
3 4310 and 25-4320 and repealing the existing sections.

5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-205 is hereby amended to read as  
7 follows: 25-205. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the  
8 names of candidates for national, state, county and township offices shall  
9 be printed upon the official primary ballot when each shall have qualified  
10 to become a candidate by one of the following methods and none other: (1)  
11 They shall have had filed in their behalf, not later than 12 noon, June 1,  
12 prior to such primary election, or if such date falls on Saturday, Sunday or  
13 a holiday, then before 12 noon of the next following day that is not a  
14 Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, nomination petitions, as provided for in this  
15 act; or (2) they shall have filed not later than the time for filing nomination  
16 petitions, as above provided, with the proper officer a declaration of  
17 intention to become a candidate, accompanied by the fee required by law.  
18 Such declaration shall be prescribed by the secretary of state.

19 (b) Nomination petitions shall be in substantially the following form:

20 I, the undersigned, an elector of the county of \_\_\_\_\_, and  
21 state of Kansas, and a duly registered voter, and a member of  
22 \_\_\_\_\_ party, hereby nominate \_\_\_\_\_, who resides in the  
23 township of \_\_\_\_\_ (or at number \_\_\_\_\_ on \_\_\_\_\_  
24 street, city of \_\_\_\_\_), in the county of \_\_\_\_\_ and  
25 state of Kansas, as a candidate for the office of (here specify the office)  
26 \_\_\_\_\_, to be voted for at the primary election to be held on the  
27 first Tuesday in August in \_\_\_\_\_, as representing the principles  
28 of such party; and I further declare that I intend to support the candidate  
29 herein named and that I have not signed and will not sign any nomination  
30 petition for any other person, for such office at such primary election.

35 All nomination petitions shall have substantially the foregoing form,  
36 written or printed at the top thereof. No signature shall be counted unless it

1 is upon a sheet having such written or printed form at the top thereof.

2 (c) Each signer of a nomination petition shall sign but one such  
3 petition for the same office, and shall declare that such person intends to  
4 support the candidate therein named, and shall add to such person's  
5 signature and residence, if in a city, by street and number (if any); or,  
6 otherwise by post-office address. No signature shall be counted unless the  
7 place of residence of the signer is clearly indicated and the date of signing  
8 given as herein required and if ditto marks are used to indicate address  
9 they shall be continuous and clearly made. Such sheets shall not be cut or  
10 pasted together.

11 (d) All signers of each separate nomination petition shall reside in the  
12 same county and election district of the office sought. The affidavit  
13 described in this paragraph of a petition circulator ~~who is a resident of the~~  
14 ~~state of Kansas and has the qualifications of an elector in the state of~~  
15 ~~Kansas~~ or of the candidate shall be appended to each petition and shall  
16 contain, at the end of each set of documents carried by each circulator *or*  
17 *the candidate*, a verification, signed by the circulator or the candidate, to  
18 the effect that such circulator or the candidate personally witnessed the  
19 signing of the petition by each person whose name appears thereon.

20 (e) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g), nomination  
21 petitions shall be signed:

22 (1) If for a state officer elected on a statewide basis or for the office  
23 of United States senator, by voters equal in number to not less than 1% of  
24 the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in the state  
25 as compiled by the office of the secretary of state;

26 (2) if for a state or national officer elected on less than a statewide  
27 basis, by voters equal in number to not less than 2% of the total of the  
28 current voter registration of the party designated in such district as  
29 compiled by the office of the secretary of state, except that for the office of  
30 district magistrate judge, by not less than 2% of the total of the current  
31 voter registration of the party designated in the county in which such office  
32 is to be filled as certified to the secretary of state in accordance with  
33 K.S.A. 25-3302, and amendments thereto;

34 (3) if for a county office, by voters equal in number to not less than  
35 3% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in  
36 such district or county as compiled by the county election officer and  
37 certified to the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A. 25-3302, and  
38 amendments thereto; and

39 (4) if for a township office, by voters equal in number to not less than  
40 3% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in  
41 such township as compiled by the county election officer and certified to  
42 the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A. 25-3302, and amendments  
43 thereto.

1 (f) Subject to the requirements of K.S.A. 25-202, and amendments  
2 thereto, any political organization filing nomination petitions for a  
3 majority of the state or county offices, as provided in this act, shall have a  
4 separate primary election ballot as a political party and, upon receipt of  
5 such nomination petitions, the respective officers shall prepare a separate  
6 state and county ballot for such new party in their respective counties or  
7 districts thereof in the same manner as is provided for existing parties.

8 (g) In any year in which districts are reapportioned for the offices of  
9 representative in the United States congress, senator and representative in  
10 the legislature of the state of Kansas or member of the state board of  
11 education:

12 (1) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the  
13 manner prescribed by law on or before May 10, nomination petitions for  
14 nomination to such offices shall be signed by voters equal in number to not  
15 less than 1% of the total of the current voter registration of the party  
16 designated in the district as compiled by the office of the secretary of state.

17 (2) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the  
18 manner prescribed by law on or after May 11, nomination petitions for  
19 nomination to the following offices shall be signed by registered voters of  
20 the party designated in the district equal in number to not less than the  
21 following:

22 (A) For the office of representative in the United States congress  
23 1,000 registered voters;

24 (B) for the office of member of the state board of education 300  
25 registered voters;

26 (C) for the office of state senator 75 registered voters; and

27 (D) for the office of state representative 25 registered voters.

28 (h) In any year in which districts are reapportioned for the offices of  
29 representative in the United States congress, senator and representative in  
30 the legislature of the state of Kansas or member of the state board of  
31 education:

32 (1) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the  
33 manner prescribed by law on or before May 10, the deadline for filing  
34 nomination petitions and declarations of intention to become a candidate  
35 for such office, accompanied by the fee required by law, shall be 12 noon  
36 on June 1, or if such date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, then  
37 before 12 noon of the next following day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or  
38 holiday.

39 (2) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the  
40 manner prescribed by law on or after May 11, the deadline for filing  
41 nomination petitions and declarations of intention to become a candidate  
42 for such office, accompanied by the fee required by law, shall be 12 noon  
43 on June 10, or if such date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, then

1 before 12 noon of the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.

2 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-302a is hereby amended to read as  
 3 follows: 25-302a. Any political party seeking official recognition in this  
 4 state after the effective date of this act shall file in its behalf, not later than  
 5 ~~12:00/2~~ noon, June 1, prior to the primary election held on the first  
 6 Tuesday of August in even-numbered years, or if such date falls on a  
 7 Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, then before ~~12:00/2~~ noon of the next  
 8 following day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday petitions signed  
 9 by qualified electors equal in number to at least 2% of the total vote cast  
 10 for all candidates for the office of governor in the state in the last  
 11 preceding general election. Such petitions shall declare support for the  
 12 official recognition of a political party, the name of which shall be stated in  
 13 the declaration. No political party seeking official recognition shall assume  
 14 a name or designation which, in the opinion of the secretary of state, is  
 15 unreasonably lengthy or so similar to the name or designation of an  
 16 existing political party as to confuse or mislead the voters at an election.

17 Petitions seeking official recognition of a political party shall be  
 18 substantially in the following form:

 20 PETITION SEEKING THE OFFICIAL RECOGNITION OF THE

22 I, the undersigned, hereby declare my support for the official  
 23 recognition of the \_\_\_\_\_ Party.

24 I have personally signed this petition; I am a registered elector of the  
 25 state of Kansas and the County of \_\_\_\_\_, and my residence  
 26 address is correctly written after my name.

27 NAME OF ADDRESS AS CITY DATE OF

29 Appended to each petition page or set of pages shall be an affidavit by  
 30 the circulator of the petition affirming that such circulator ~~is a resident of~~  
 31 ~~the state of Kansas and has the qualifications of an elector in Kansas and~~  
 32 ~~that the circulator~~ personally witnessed the signing of the petition by each  
 33 person whose name appears thereon. The affidavit shall be executed before  
 34 a person authorized to administer oaths and include the address of the  
 35 circulator.

36 Each page of such petition shall bear the names of registered voters of a  
 37 single county. All petitions shall be grouped according to the county in  
 38 which each was circulated before being filed with the secretary of state.  
 39 All such petitions shall be filed at one time. Any related petitions presented  
 40 thereafter will be deemed to be separate and not a part of earlier filings.  
 41 County election officers shall cooperate with the secretary of state in  
 42 verifying the sufficiency of these petitions as required by law.

43 The secretary of state shall transmit such petitions to the county

1 election officer of each county for which petitions were presented to be  
2 examined for sufficiency pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 25-3601 *et*  
3 *seq.*, and amendments thereto, and applicable regulations. Not more than  
4 20 days following receipt of such petitions from the secretary of state, the  
5 county election officer shall return these documents to the secretary of  
6 state certifying the number of sufficient signatures thereon. The secretary  
7 of state shall gather all petitions and determine whether a sufficient  
8 number of signatures was submitted. The secretary of state shall forthwith  
9 notify the person who submitted the declaration of intent to circulate such  
10 petitions of the sufficiency or insufficiency of the number of signatures.

11 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-303 is hereby amended to read as  
12 follows: 25-303. (a) This section shall not apply to city and school  
13 elections, nor to election of other officers provided by law to be elected in  
14 April.

15 (b) All nominations other than party nominations shall be  
16 independent nominations. No person who has declared and retains a party  
17 affiliation in accordance with K.S.A. 25-3301, and amendments thereto,  
18 shall be eligible to accept an independent nomination for any office.

19 Independent nominations of candidates for any office to be filled by the  
20 voters of the state at large may be made by nomination petitions signed by  
21 not less than 5,000 qualified voters for each candidate and in the case of  
22 governor and lieutenant governor for each pair of such candidates.

23 (c) Independent nominations of candidates for offices to be filled by  
24 the voters of a county, district or other division less than a state may be  
25 made by nomination petitions signed by voters equal in number to not less  
26 than 4% of the current total of qualified voters of such county, district or  
27 other division as compiled by the office of the secretary of state in the case  
28 of state offices and as compiled in the office of the county election officer  
29 and certified to the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A. 25-2311,  
30 and amendments thereto, in the case of local offices, and in no case to be  
31 signed by less than 25 nor more than 5,000 qualified voters of such county,  
32 district or division, for each candidate.

33 (d) Independent nominations of candidates for offices to be filled by  
34 the voters of a township may be made by nomination papers signed by not  
35 less than 5% of the current total of qualified voters of such township,  
36 computed as above provided, for each candidate, and in no case to be  
37 signed by less than 10 such voters of such township for each candidate.

38 (e) The signatures to such nomination petitions need not all be  
39 appended to one paper, but each registered voter signing an independent  
40 certificate of nomination shall add to the signature such petitioner's place  
41 of residence and post office address. All signers of each separate  
42 nomination petition shall reside in the same county and election district of  
43 the office sought. The affidavit of the candidate or a petition circulator

1 ~~who is a resident of the state of Kansas and has the qualifications of an~~  
2 ~~elector of the state of Kansas~~ shall be appended to each petition and shall  
3 contain, at the end of each set of documents carried by each circulator *or*  
4 *candidate*, a verification, signed by the circulator *or candidate*, to the  
5 effect that such circulator *or candidate* personally witnessed the signing of  
6 the petition by each person whose name appears thereon.

7 (f) No such nomination paper shall contain the name of a candidate  
8 for governor without in the same such paper containing the name of a  
9 candidate for lieutenant governor, and if it does it shall be void.

10 (g) No person shall join in nominating more than one person for the  
11 same office, and if this is done, the name of such petitioner shall not be  
12 counted on any certificate.

13 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-3602 is hereby amended to read as  
14 follows: 25-3602. (a) Each petition shall consist of one or more documents  
15 pertaining to a single issue or proposition under one distinctive title. The  
16 documents shall be filed with the county election officer or other official,  
17 if another official is designated in the applicable statutes. The filing shall  
18 be made at one time all in one group. Later or successive filings of  
19 documents relating to the same issue or proposition shall be deemed to be  
20 separate petitions and not a part of any earlier or later filing.

21 (b) Unless otherwise specifically required, each petition shall: (1)  
22 State the question which petitioners seek to bring to an election in the form  
23 of a question as it should appear upon the ballot in accordance with the  
24 requirements of K.S.A. 25-620 and K.S.A. 25-3601, and amendments  
25 thereto;

26 (2) name the taxing subdivision or other political subdivision in  
27 which an election is sought to be held;

28 (3) contain the following recital above the spaces provided for  
29 signatures: "I have personally signed this petition. I am a registered elector  
30 of the state of Kansas and of \_\_\_\_\_

31 (here insert name of political or taxing subdivision)  
32 and my residence address is correctly written after my name."

33 The recital shall be followed by blank spaces for the signature,  
34 residence address and date of signing for each person signing the petition.

35 When petitioners are required by law to possess qualifications in  
36 addition to being registered electors, the form of the petition shall be  
37 amended to contain a recital specifying the additional qualifications  
38 required and stating that the petitioners possess the qualifications; and

39 (4) contain the following recital, at the end of each set of documents  
40 carried by each circulator: "I am the circulator of this petition and ~~a~~  
41 ~~resident of the state of Kansas and possess the qualifications of an elector~~  
42 ~~of the state of Kansas. I have personally witnessed the signing of the~~  
43 petition by each person whose name appears thereon.

The recital of the circulator of each petition shall be verified upon oath or affirmation before a notarial officer in the manner prescribed by K.S.A. 53-501, *et seq.*, and amendments thereto.

(c) Any person who has signed a petition who desires to withdraw such person's name may do so by giving written notice to the county election officer or other designated official not later than the third day following the date upon which the petition is filed.

(d) Any petition shall be null and void unless submitted to the county election officer or other designated official within 180 days of the date of the first signature on the petition.

(e) Unless the governing body of the political or taxing subdivision in which the election is sought to be held authorizes a special election, all elections which are called as a result of the filing of a sufficient petition shall be held at the next succeeding primary or general election as defined by K.S.A. 25-2502, and amendments thereto, in which the political or taxing subdivision is participating.

(f) When a petition requires signatures equal in number to a percentage of the total number of registered voters, such percentage shall be based on the most recent number of registered voters as certified to the office of the secretary of state pursuant to subsection (g) of K.S.A. 25-2311, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-4005 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-4005. The nomination papers or petitions as mentioned in K.S.A. 25-4004, and amendments thereto, shall be in substantially the following form:

I, the undersigned, an elector of the county of \_\_\_\_\_, and state of Kansas, and a duly registered voter and a member of the \_\_\_\_\_ party, hereby nominate \_\_\_\_\_

and state of Kansas as a candidate for the office of governor, and running with such candidate \_\_\_\_\_

and state of Kansas as a candidate for the office of lieutenant governor to be voted for at the primary to be held on the first Tuesday in August in \_\_\_\_\_, as representing the principles of such party; and I further declare that I intend to support the candidates herein named and that I have not signed and will not sign any petition or nomination paper for any other persons, for such offices at the next ensuing election.

5 All nomination papers shall have substantially the foregoing form,  
 6 written or printed at the top thereof. No signature shall be counted unless it  
 7 is upon a sheet having such written or printed form at the top thereof.

8 Each signer of a nomination paper shall sign but one such paper for  
 9 governor and lieutenant governor, and shall declare that such signer  
 10 intends to support the candidates therein named, and shall add to the  
 11 signer's signature the signer's residence, if in a city, by street and number  
 12 (if any); or, otherwise by address as shown on such signer's registration.  
 13 No signature shall be counted unless the place of residence of the signer is  
 14 clearly indicated and the date of signing given as herein required and if  
 15 ditto marks are used to indicate address they shall be continuous and  
 16 clearly made. Such sheets shall not be cut or pasted together.

17 All signers of each separate nomination paper shall reside in the same  
 18 county. The affidavit of a petition circulator ~~who is a resident of the state~~  
 19 ~~of Kansas and has the qualifications of an elector of the state of Kansas~~  
 20 shall be appended to each such nomination paper, stating that to the best of  
 21 such petition circulator's knowledge and belief, all the signers thereof are  
 22 qualified electors of that county; that the petition circulator knows that  
 23 they signed the same with full knowledge of the contents thereof; that their  
 24 respective residences are correctly stated therein; that each signer signed  
 25 the same on the date stated opposite such signer's name, and that the  
 26 affiant intends to support the candidates therein named. Such affidavit  
 27 shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts therein stated.

28 Such nomination papers shall be signed by not less than 1% of the total  
 29 vote of the party designated in the state. The basis of the percentage shall  
 30 be the vote of the party for secretary of state at the last preceding general  
 31 election of secretary of state; or, in case of a new party, the basis of a  
 32 percentage shall be the vote cast for the successful candidate for secretary  
 33 of state at the last preceding general election of secretary of state.

34 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-4306 is hereby amended to read as  
 35 follows: 25-4306. The application under K.S.A. 25-4305, *and amendments*  
 36 *thereto*, shall include (a) the name and office of the person sought to be  
 37 recalled, (b) the grounds for recall described in particular in not more than  
 38 200 words, (c) a statement that the sponsors ~~are residents of the state of~~  
 39 ~~Kansas and possess the qualifications of an elector of the state of Kansas~~  
 40 ~~and who~~ signed the application with the statement of grounds for recall  
 41 attached, (d) the designation of a recall committee of three sponsors who  
 42 shall represent all sponsors and subscribers in matters relating to the recall,  
 43 (e) the designation of at least 100 residents of the state of Kansas who



1 possess the qualifications of electors of the state of Kansas and who  
2 subscribe to the application as sponsors for purposes of circulation, and (f)  
3 the signatures and addresses of registered electors in the state or election  
4 district of the state officer sought to be recalled equal in number to not less  
5 than 10% of the votes cast for all candidates for the office of the state  
6 officer sought to be recalled, such percentage to be based upon the last  
7 general election for the current term of office of the officer sought to be  
8 recalled.

9 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-4310 is hereby amended to read as  
10 follows: 25-4310. The petitions may be circulated ~~only by a sponsor who~~  
11 ~~is a resident of the state of Kansas and possesses the qualifications of an~~  
12 ~~elector of the state of Kansas and only in person throughout the state or~~  
13 election district of the state officer sought to be recalled. No copy of a  
14 petition shall be circulated in more than one county, and the county  
15 election officer of the county in which each petition is circulated shall  
16 certify to the secretary of state the sufficiency of the signatures on the  
17 petition. Any registered elector of such election district or of the state, as  
18 the case may be, may subscribe to the petition by signing the elector's  
19 name and address as the same appears on the voter registration books. A  
20 person who has signed the petition may withdraw such person's name only  
21 by giving written notice to the secretary of state before the date the petition  
22 is filed. The necessary signatures on a petition shall be secured within 90  
23 days from the date that the petitions prepared by the secretary of state  
24 pursuant to K.S.A. 25-4309, and amendments thereto, are delivered to the  
25 recall committee. The petition shall be signed only in ink. Illegible  
26 signatures unless accompanied by a legible printed name may be rejected  
27 by the secretary of state or by any county election officer assisting the  
28 secretary of state.

29 Sec. 8. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-4320 is hereby amended to read as  
30 follows: 25-4320. (a) Each petition for recall of a local officer shall  
31 include: (1) The name and office of the local officer sought to be recalled;  
32 (2) the grounds for recall described in particular in not more than 200  
33 words; (3) a statement that the petition signers are registered electors of  
34 the election district of the local officer sought to be recalled; (4) the names  
35 and addresses of three registered electors of the election district of the  
36 officer sought to be recalled who shall comprise the recall committee; (5)  
37 the statement of warning required in K.S.A. 25-4321, and amendments  
38 thereto; and (6) a statement that a list of all ~~sponsors~~ *persons* authorized to  
39 circulate recall petitions for such recall may be examined in the office of  
40 the county election officer where the petition is required to be filed. ~~Each~~  
41 ~~sponsor shall be a resident of the state of Kansas and possess the~~  
42 ~~qualifications of an elector of the state of Kansas.~~

43 (b) Each page of a petition for recall of a local officer shall be in

1 substantially the following form:

2 I, the undersigned, hereby seek the recall of \_\_\_\_\_ from the  
 3 office of \_\_\_\_\_, on the ground(s)  
 4 that \_\_\_\_\_,(state specific grounds) and  
 5 declare that I am a registered elector of \_\_\_\_\_ County,

13 1. It is a class B misdemeanor to sign a name other than your own  
 14 name to this petition, to knowingly sign more than once for the recall of  
 15 the same officer at the same election or to sign this petition knowing you  
 16 are not a registered elector.

17 2. The following comprise the recall committee:

20 3. A list of all sponsors authorized to circulate petitions for this recall  
 21 may be examined in the office of the \_\_\_\_\_ County election

23 (c) A county election officer shall provide a sample of the form  
 24 prescribed by subsection (b) upon request by any person.

25 (d) The affidavit required by K.S.A. 25-4325, and amendments  
 26 thereto, shall be appended to each petition for recall of a local officer.

27 Sec. 9. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 25-205, 25-302a, 25-303, 25-3602, 25-  
 28 4005, 25-4306, 25-4310 and 25-4320 are hereby repealed.

29 Sec. 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its  
 30 publication in the Kansas register.
