1 AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to competitive bidding; 2 amending K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 75-3740 and repealing the existing 3 section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 75-3740 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 75-3740. (a) Except as provided by K.S.A. 75-3740b, and 8 amendments thereto, and subsection (g), all contracts and purchases made 9 by or under the supervision of the director of purchases or any state agency for which competitive bids are required shall be awarded to the lowest 10 11 responsible bidder, taking into consideration conformity with the 12 specifications, terms of delivery, and other conditions imposed in the call 13 for bids.

(b) The director of purchases shall have power to decide as to thelowest responsible bidder for all purchases, but if:

16 (1) The dollar amount of the bid received from the lowest responsible 17 bidder from within the state is identical to the dollar amount of the bid 18 received from the lowest responsible bidder from without the state, the 19 contract shall be awarded to the bidder from within the state; and

(2) in the case of bids for paper products specified in K.S.A. 753740b, *and amendments thereto*, the dollar amounts of the bids received
from two or more lowest responsible bidders are identical, the contract
shall be awarded to the bidder whose bid is for those paper products
containing the highest percentage of recycled materials.

25 (c) Any or all bids may be rejected, and a bid shall be rejected if it 26 contains any material alteration or erasure made after the bid is opened. The director of purchases may reject the bid of any bidder who is in 27 28 arrears on taxes due the state, who is not properly registered to collect and 29 remit taxes due the state or who has failed to perform satisfactorily on a previous contract with the state. The secretary of revenue is hereby 30 31 authorized to exchange such information with the director of purchases as 32 is necessary to effectuate the preceding sentence notwithstanding any other provision of law prohibiting disclosure of the contents of taxpaver records 33 or information. Prior to determining the lowest responsible bidder on 34 35 contracts for construction of buildings or for major repairs or improvements to buildings for state agencies, the director of purchases 36

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1 shall consider: (1) The criteria and information developed by the secretary 2 of administration, with the advice of the state building advisory 3 commission to rate contractors on the basis of their performance under 4 similar contracts with the state, local governmental entities and private 5 entities, in addition to other criteria and information available;; and (2) the 6 recommendations of the project architect, or, if there is no project 7 architect, the recommendations of the secretary of administration or the 8 agency architect for the project as provided in K.S.A. 75-1254, and 9 amendments thereto. In any case where competitive bids are required and 10 where all bids are rejected, new bids shall be called for as in the first instance, unless otherwise expressly provided by law or the state agency 11 12 elects not to proceed with the procurement.

13 (d) Before the awarding of any contract for construction of a building 14 or the making of repairs or improvements upon any building for a state agency, the director of purchases shall receive written approval from the 15 16 state agency for which the building construction project has been 17 approved, that the bids generally conform with the plans and specifications 18 prepared by the project architect, by the secretary of administration or by 19 the agency architect for the project, as the case may be, so as to avoid error 20 and mistake on the part of the contractors. In all cases where material 21 described in a contract can be obtained from any state institution, the 22 director of purchases shall exclude the same from the contract.

23 (e) All bids with the names of the bidders and the amounts thereof. 24 together with all documents pertaining to the award of a contract, shall be 25 made a part of a file or record and retained by the director of purchases for 26 five years, unless reproduced as provided in K.S.A. 75-3737, and 27 amendments thereto, and shall be open to public inspection at all 28 reasonable times.

29 (f) As used in this section and in K.S.A. 75-3741, and amendments 30 thereto, "project architect" shall have the meaning ascribed thereto in 31 K.S.A. 75-1251, and amendments thereto.

32 (g) When a state agency is receiving bids to purchase passenger 33 motor vehicles, such agency shall follow the procedures prescribed in 34 subsection (b)(1), except in the case where one of the responsible bidders 35 offers motor vehicles which are assembled in Kansas. In such a case, $\frac{10\%}{10\%}$ 36 3% of the bid of the responsible bidder which offers motor vehicles 37 assembled in Kansas shall be subtracted from the bid amount, and that 38 amount shall be used to determine the lowest bid pursuant to subsection 39 (b)(1). This section shall only apply to bids which match the exact motor 40 vehicle specifications of the agency purchasing passenger motor vehicles. 41

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 75-3740 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 42 43 publication in the statute book.
