SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2001

As Recommended by House Committee on
Corrections and Juvenile Justice

Brief*

HB 2001 would amend the statute governing the Law Enforcement Training Reimbursement Fund to require that all expenditures made from the Fund be “in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports pursuant to vouchers approved by the [Kansas Commission on Peace Officers’ Standards and Training (KCPOST)] or by a person or persons designated by the commission.” This language would give KCPOST the authority to expend money from that fund, which is located in the State Treasury. Similar language appears in other statutes governing fee fund expenditures. The Fund receives \$1 from the \$20 assessment imposed by KSA 12-4117(a) in each case filed in municipal court other than a non-moving traffic violation, where there is a finding of guilt, plea of guilty, plea of no contest, forfeiture of bond, or a diversion.

Background

HB 2001 was introduced to make technical changes concerning spending that were not made when KCPOST separated from the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center (KLETC).

In the House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice, the Directors of the KLETC and of the KCPOST appeared in support of HB 2001. No opponents provided

testimony. The Committee made no changes to the bill and recommended it be passed.

The League of Kansas Municipalities reports the bill would have negligible effects on Kansas municipalities and KCPOST indicated that it would have no fiscal impact on the agency.
