SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2469

As Amended by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

Brief*

HB 2469 would require a defendant pay an application fee of \$100 to the clerk of the district court to request indigent defense services in a proceeding for a violation of a condition of release. The fee would be required regardless of whether the defendant has paid application fees in another proceeding.

Background

In the House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice, Patricia Scalia, Executive Director, Board of Indigents' Defense Services (BIDS), appeared in support of the bill. No opponents offered testimony. The Committee amended the bill by making the new language its own sentence for the sake of clarity.

The fiscal note for HB 2469, as introduced, indicates passage would allow BIDS to collect approximately \$100,000 by the conclusion of FY 2013 and \$500,000 in FY 2014, when the requirements would have been fully in effect for the year.
