



Since 1999, the Kansas Highway Patrol has served as the Governor-appointed State Administrative Agency (SAA) for the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP).

The Homeland Security Grant Program is funded through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS).



Through this program, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) provides funding opportunities to states and territories to prevent, respond to, and recover from all-hazard events by enhancing and sustaining capabilities.



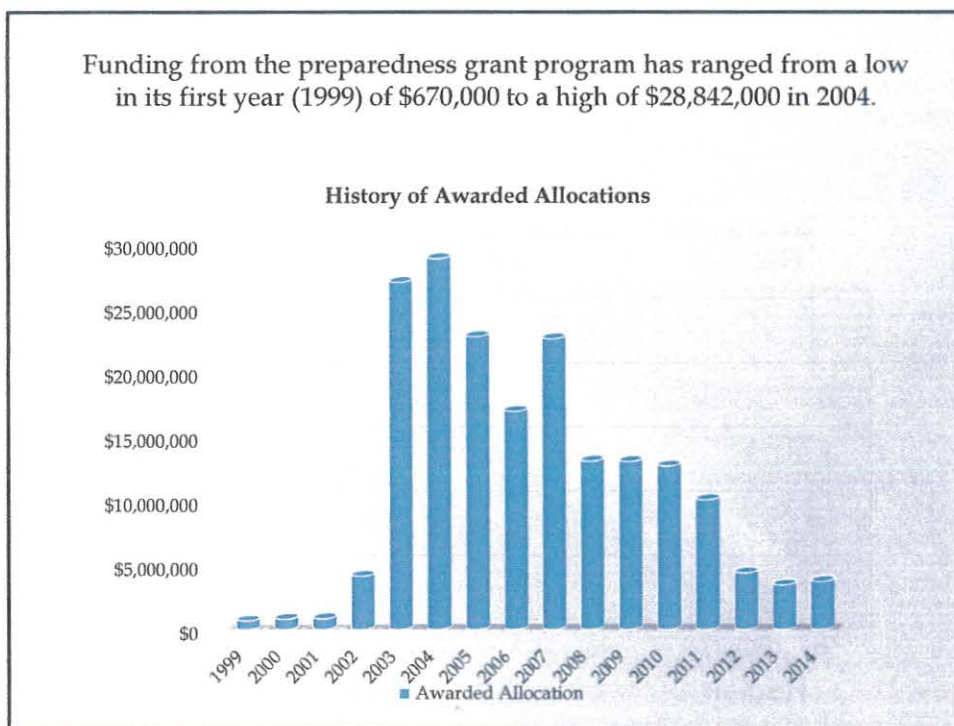

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The Kansas Highway Patrol Homeland Security Operations (KHP HSO), applies for, administers, manages, and reports to the Department of Homeland Security regarding all preparedness grant program operations funded by DHS.

The SAA meets with regional and state partners during the grant application process to ensure that the proposed projects for funding contain consistency and compliance with the Kansas Homeland Security Strategy, State Preparedness Report, and Kansas Investment Justification.

The SAA submits one grant application on behalf of all eligible sub grantees.

Funding from the preparedness grant program has ranged from a low in its first year (1999) of \$670,000 to a high of \$28,842,000 in 2004.



Prior to FFY 2006, the Patrol passed through program funding to Kansas' 105 county governments.

Beginning in FFY 2006, the SAA began providing funds to each of its newly formed, homeland security regions, which eliminated individual counties as sub-recipients.

Regionalization is an initiative that Kansas believes enhances the all hazard approach put toward our level of preparedness.

Not only does the regional concept work well for administering preparedness grants, it has served as an excellent conduit for other emergency response initiatives.

Currently, the SAA is managing two open grant programs FY2013 and FY2014, both focusing primarily on sustainment of existing capabilities.

- Allocations to grant sub-recipients is determined by the combination of population and risk-based formula.

Some of the capabilities and enhancements occurring through approximately 70 FY14 grant projects provide funding for planning, organization, equipment, training and exercises such as:

Interoperable Communications Sustainment

- ☐ Purchase of radios for various agencies such as Ambulances, Public Works and IMT members in order to enhance the ability to communicate during an incident.

Accountability Sustainment

- ☐ Purchase of equipment, upgrades, comprehensive resource management and credential system and provides funds for training.

Active Shooter

- ☐ Funds active shooter training for law enforcement, dispatchers and other first responders.

Shelter Management

- ☐ Purchase of shelter carts that can be set up at a location to shelter citizens displaced following a disaster.

FY14 grant projects continued...

Incident Management Team (IMT)

- ☐ Purchase of deployment supplies, equipment and contractual training for IMT members to attend position specific training.

Portable Message Board

- ☐ Purchase of portable message boards to provide information to the public.

Light Tower System

- ☐ Purchase of light towers with generators that can be of great benefit in numerous situations such as a natural disaster where power may not be available to provide light to first responders.

Stop Movement

- ☐ Purchase of trailer and necessary equipment to stop movement of traffic during an incident such as a disaster or foreign animal disease incident.

FY14 grant projects continued...

Search and Rescue

- ☐ Purchase of equipment and funds provide training for Mass Search and Rescue Operations.

CBRNE Response Truck

- ☐ Purchase of a truck box for preventive/proactive explosive sweeps and responses.

Animal Rescue

- ☐ Purchase of portable cattle panels for response to overturned animal trailers, keeping the roadways safe.

Fusion Center Sustainment

- ☐ Funds analyst positions within KDEM, KBI and KHP for the purpose of focusing on threats as they relate to the state of Kansas. These positions assist in the analysis and dissemination of intelligence information within the State of Kansas with partnering agencies. These projects also purchase necessary equipment.
