Chairman Kleeb and Members of the House Commerce and Economic Development Committee:

The local chambers of commerce listed above would like to express our support for the majority of provisions proposed in HB 2124. We are pleased that this committee is considering language to improve current statutes regarding Employment Security Law benefits.

We support the recommended changes listed below:

- Modifying wages to include holiday pay. Section 1, page 2, line 36 page 3, line 9
- An employee is not eligible to receive unemployment benefits, while the employee receives severance pay. Section 1, page 3, line 37 page 4, line 11
- Clarifying gross misconduct and misconduct in the statute. Section 2, page 7 11
- Increase penalty for individuals who knowingly make false statements to obtain or increase benefits. Section 2, page 12, lines 14 & 16
- Lower the rate for new employers from 4.0% to 2.7%. Section 3, page 17, lines 7 16
- Change the high cost multiplier from 1.2 to 1.0. Section 3, page 26, lines 7 13
- Notification of employers by November 15 of their new contribution rates. Section 4, page 30, lines 20 -21
- Eliminate the Employment Security Advisory Council (ESAC). Section 5, page 32, line 43 page 33, line 26

The chambers listed above do not have a position on changing the benefit weeks from 26 to 20 when the state's unemployment rate drops below 6%. Section 1, page 4, lines 12 - 15
