## **ERO 42**

Governor Brownback signed ERO 42 on Friday, January 19, which starts the 60-day clock

Effective date of consolidation will be the beginning of Fiscal Year 2014 (July 1, 2013)

ERO 42 purpose is to improve the quality of juvenile corrections

## Minimal Administrative Consolidation

#### FY 2011 Budget began a limited administrative consolidation of KDOC-JJA

### **Other States**

9 other states have an organizational structure where juvenile corrections/services are placed within the Department of Corrections

Those states include: Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, North Carolina, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Indiana, Maine, & California

JJA Acting Commissioner Terri Williams will continue as Deputy Secretary of Juvenile Services Resolution of pay scale equalization between **KDOC & JJA uniformed staff** Working toward resolution of the Legislative Post Audit results Security audits led by Secretary Roberts & other **KDOC** staff
