Fee Levels:

Missouri Animal Care Facilities Act establishes license categories that are somewhat similar to KS. Their fee schedule differs in that theirs is based on a flat fee of \$100 plus an annual per capita fee that typically caps at \$2500. Average fees for the previous license year are noted below:

Nebraska has a fee structure in which dealers, shelters, commercial dealers, and boarding kennels are capped at \$2000. Animal rescues are set at \$125.

Colorado's fees are set and range from \$175 to \$350.

*It is somewhat difficult to compare states because most programs have different license categories as well as different definitions within those categories

Out-of State Distributors:

Kansas requires that out-of-state distributors be licensed. An out-of-state distributor is any person residing in a state other than Kansas, who is engaged in the business of buying for resale dogs or cats, or both, within the state of Kansas. This license category was initially created in order to ensure that individuals from other states that were coming in to KS to purchase dogs/cats for the purpose of resale outside of KS were paying fees, such as is required of our in-state licensees when conducting the same business.

Missouri and Nebraska have similar fees in place. Missouri requires a license fee of \$125 plus an additional \$1 for every animal. They currently have approximately thirty of these individuals. Nebraska requires anyone coming in to the state for the purpose of purchasing a dog/cat for resale to license as if they were in Nebraska.

States that have a program in place that is somewhat similar to ours that do not charge a fee includes lowa and Colorado.
