AN ACT concerning pharmacy technicians; relating to requirements for licensure.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

- Section 1. (a) A person shall not work as a pharmacy technician or pharmacy technician trainee unless the pharmacy technician or pharmacy technician trainee is registered with the board of pharmacy.
- (b) To be eligible to be registered as a pharmacy technician trainee the applicant shall:
 - (1) Be of good moral character;
 - (2) be at least 18 years of age; and
- (3) have a high school diploma or the equivalent of a high school diploma.
- (c) To be registered as a pharmacy technician the applicant must meet the qualification in subsection (b), and:
- (1) Have taken and passed a national pharmacy technician certification examination approved by the board of pharmacy and have a current certification certificate; or
- (2) have an exemption from certification granted by the board by maintaining an active pharmacy technician registration with the board of pharmacy from prior to July 1, 2008.
- (d) Each applicant for pharmacy technician trainee after July 1, 2015, shall meet the requirements of subsection (b) and have not previously applied and been registered as a pharmacy technician.
- (e) Pharmacy technician trainee registrations will expire 12 months from the date of registration or upon issuance as a registered pharmacy technician, whichever occurs first.
- (f) The board of pharmacy shall adopt rules and regulations to implement this section.
- (g) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
