HOUSE BILL No. 2265

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AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to instruction expenditures; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-64c01 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-64c01 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-64c01. (a) It is the public policy goal of the state of Kansasthat—At least 65% of the moneys appropriated, distributed or otherwise provided by the state to school districts shall be expended in the classroom or for instruction.

- (b) All moneys attributable to the increase in the amount of base state aid per pupil under the provisions of this act shall be expended in the classroom or for instruction.
- (c) The amount of moneys expended per pupil in the classroom or for instruction in school year 2005-2006, shall not be less than the amount of moneys expended per pupil for such purposes in school year 2004-2005, plus \$35 per pupil.
- (d) If the state board of education determines that a school district has violated subsections (a) or (b) by failing to expend such moneys during the applicable fiscal year of that school district, the following shall occur:
- (1) Upon the first violation, within one month of receiving the state board of education written determination of the school district's violation, the board of education of the school district shall publish a copy of such information in the official newspaper of the school district and on the district's internet website; and
- (2) upon the second consecutive violation, the state board of education shall determine the amount of moneys which had not been expended in accordance with this section and deduct the same from the amounts of general state aid payable to the school district during the next school year.
- (d) (e) As used in this section, "instruction" means the activities dealing directly with the interaction between teachers and students and may be provided in a school classroom, in another location such as a home or hospital, and in other learning situations such as those involving cocurricular activities. Instruction also may be provided through the

2 correspondence that is delivered inside or outside the classroom and other
3 teacher-student settings or through other approved media. Instruction also
4 includes the activities of aides or classroom assistants of any type
5 including, but not limited to, clerks, graders and teaching machines which
6 assist in the instructional process.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-64c01 is hereby repealed.
