HOUSE BILL No. 2277

By Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

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1 AN ACT concerning law enforcement; relating to the juvenile justice 2 authority; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 38-2386 and 74-5602 and 3 repealing the existing sections.

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5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 38-2386 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 38-2386. (a) The superintendent of any juvenile correctional 8 facility operated by the commissioner, all persons on the staff of the 9 juvenile justice authority who are in the chain of command from the commissioner of juvenile justice to the juvenile corrections officer and 10 every juvenile corrections officer, regardless of rank and every 11 12 investigator, while acting within the scope of their duties as employees of 13 the juvenile justice authority, shall possess such powers and duties of a law 14 enforcement officer as are necessary for performing such duties-for the 15 purpose of regaining or maintaining custody, security and control of any 16 person in the custody of the commissioner and may exercise such powers 17 and duties anywhere within the state of Kansas. Such powers and duties 18 may be exercised outside the state of Kansas for the purpose of 19 maintaining custody, security and control of any person in the custody of 20 the commissioner being transported or escorted by anyone authorized to so 21 act. Such employees of the juvenile justice authority shall be responsible 22 to and shall be at all times under the supervision and control of the 23 commissioner of juvenile justice or the commissioner's designee.

24 (b) The commissioner shall have the authority to appoint and designate special investigators. Each special investigator designated by the 25 26 commissioner is hereby vested with the power and authority of peace and 27 police officers and shall have the authority to:

28 (1) Make arrests;

29 (2) conduct searches and seizures:

30 (3) maintain custody, security and control of any person in the eustody of the commissioner: and 31

32 (4) generally enforce all the criminal laws of the state as violations of 33 those laws are encountered during the routine performance of duty.

34 (c) No special investigator may carry firearms while performing such 35 duties without having first successfully completed the training courseprescribed for law enforcement officers under the Kansas law enforcement 36

1 training act, K.S.A. 74-5601 et seq., and amendments thereto.

2 (d) Each special investigator designated shall:

(1) Be vested with law enforcement authority;

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(2) be in classified service under the Kansas eivil service act; and

5 (3) be subject to the requirements of the Kansas law enforcement-6 training act, K.S.A. 74-5601 et seq., and amendments thereto.

7 (c) The commissioner may adopt rules and regulations prescribing 8 additional training required for such special investigators.

9 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-5602 is hereby amended to read as 10 follows: 74-5602. As used in the Kansas law enforcement training act:

(a) "Training center" means the law enforcement training center
within the university of Kansas, created by K.S.A. 74-5603, and
amendments thereto.

(b) "Commission" means the Kansas commission on peace officers'
standards and training, created by K.S.A. 74-5606, and amendments
thereto, or the commission's designee.

(c) "Chancellor" means the chancellor of the university of Kansas, orthe chancellor's designee.

(d) "Director of police training" means the director of police trainingat the law enforcement training center.

(e) "Director" means the executive director of the Kansas commissionon peace officers' standards and training.

(f) "Law enforcement" means the prevention or detection of crime
and the enforcement of the criminal or traffic laws of this state or of any
municipality thereof.

(g) "Police officer" or "law enforcement officer" means a full-time or 26 part-time salaried officer or employee of the state, a county or a city, 27 whose duties include the prevention or detection of crime and the 28 29 enforcement of the criminal or traffic laws of this state or of any municipality thereof. Such terms shall include, but not be limited to: The 30 31 sheriff, undersheriff and full-time or part-time salaried deputies in the 32 sheriff's office in each county; deputy sheriffs deputized pursuant to 33 K.S.A. 19-2858, and amendments thereto; conservation officers of the 34 Kansas department of wildlife, parks and tourism; university police officers, as defined in K.S.A. 22-2401a, and amendments thereto; campus 35 police officers, as defined in K.S.A. 22-2401a, and amendments thereto; 36 37 law enforcement agents of the director of alcoholic beverage control; law 38 enforcement agents designated by the secretary of revenue pursuant to 39 K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 75-5157, and amendments thereto; law enforcement agents of the Kansas lottery; law enforcement agents of the Kansas racing 40 commission; deputies and assistants of the state fire marshal having law 41 enforcement authority; capitol police, existing under the authority of 42 43 K.S.A. 75-4503, and amendments thereto; special investigators of the-

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juvenile justice authority; and law enforcement officers appointed by the 1 2 adjutant general pursuant to K.S.A. 48-204, and amendments thereto. Such 3 terms shall also include railroad policemen appointed pursuant to K.S.A. 4 66-524, and amendments thereto; school security officers designated as 5 school law enforcement officers pursuant to K.S.A. 72-8222, and 6 amendments thereto; the manager and employees of the horsethief 7 reservoir benefit district pursuant to K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 82a-2212, and 8 amendments thereto; and the director of the Kansas commission on peace 9 officers' standards and training and any other employee of such 10 commission designated by the director pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5603, and amendments thereto, as a law enforcement officer. Such terms shall not 11 include any elected official, other than a sheriff, serving in the capacity of 12 13 a law enforcement or police officer solely by virtue of such official's elected position; any attorney-at-law having responsibility for law 14 15 enforcement and discharging such responsibility solely in the capacity of 16 an attorney; any employee of the commissioner of juvenile justice who is employed solely to perform correctional, administrative or operational 17 18 duties related to juvenile correctional facilities; any employee of the 19 secretary of corrections, any employee of the secretary of social and 20 rehabilitation services; any deputy conservation officer of the Kansas 21 department of wildlife, parks and tourism; or any employee of a city or 22 county who is employed solely to perform correctional duties related to 23 jail inmates and the administration and operation of a jail; or any full-time 24 or part-time salaried officer or employee whose duties include the issuance 25 of a citation or notice to appear provided such officer or employee is not vested by law with the authority to make an arrest for violation of the laws 26 27 of this state or any municipality thereof, and is not authorized to carry 28 firearms when discharging the duties of such person's office or 29 employment. Such term shall include any officer appointed or elected on a 30 provisional basis.

(h) "Full-time" means employment requiring at least 1,000 hours oflaw enforcement related work per year.

(i) "Part-time" means employment on a regular schedule or
employment which requires a minimum number of hours each payroll
period, but in any case requiring less than 1,000 hours of law enforcement
related work per year.

(j) "Misdemeanor crime of domestic violence" means a violation of domestic battery as provided by K.S.A. 21-3412a, prior to its repeal, or K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 21-5414, and amendments thereto, or any other misdemeanor under federal, municipal or state law that has as an element the use or attempted use of physical force, or the threatened use of a deadly weapon, committed by a current or former spouse, parent, or guardian of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabiting with or has cohabited with the
victim as a spouse, parent or guardian, or by a person similarly situated to
a spouse, parent or guardian of the victim.

4 (k) "Auxiliary personnel" means members of organized nonsalaried
5 groups who operate as an adjunct to a police or sheriff's department,
6 including reserve officers, posses and search and rescue groups.

7 (1) "Active law enforcement certificate" means a certificate which 8 attests to the qualification of a person to perform the duties of a law 9 enforcement officer and which has not been suspended or revoked by 10 action of the Kansas commission on peace officers' standards and training 11 and has not lapsed by operation of law as provided in K.S.A. 74-5622, and 12 amendments thereto.

13 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 38-2386 and 74-5602 are hereby repealed.
