

## Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2452

By Committee on Transportation

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1 AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;  
2 providing for the donate life, disabled veterans, rotary international and  
3 Kansas horse council license plates; amending K.S.A. 8-161 and  
4 repealing the existing section.  
5

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2015, any owner or lessee  
8 of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight  
9 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance  
10 with the provisions of this section, may be issued one donate life license  
11 plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be  
12 issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration  
13 and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and  
14 amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county treasurer of the  
15 logo use royalty payment established by midwest transplant network or the  
16 presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
17 subsection (b).

18 (b) The board of directors of midwest transplant network may  
19 authorize the use of their donate life logo to be affixed on license plates as  
20 provided by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this  
21 section shall be used to support midwest transplant network. Any motor  
22 vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to midwest transplant network  
23 for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to either:  
24 (1) Midwest transplant network in an amount of not less than \$25 nor more  
25 than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued,  
26 midwest transplant network shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or  
27 lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, which  
28 shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of  
29 registration; or (2) the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for  
30 each license plate to be issued.

31 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may  
32 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such  
33 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished  
34 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall  
35 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
36 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment

1 established by midwest transplant network. Application for registration of  
2 a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this  
3 section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the  
4 director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

5 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be  
6 transferable to any other person.

7 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer donate life license plates  
8 from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

9 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,  
10 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner  
11 prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No  
12 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant  
13 provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization  
14 statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the logo use  
15 royalty payment as established by midwest transplant network. If such  
16 logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration  
17 or faxed by midwest transplant network, or the annual logo use royalty  
18 payment is not made to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the  
19 applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments  
20 thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's  
21 residence.

22 (g) Midwest transplant network shall:

23 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized  
24 by this section; and

25 (2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number  
26 where applicants can call midwest transplant network for information  
27 concerning the application process or the status of their license plate  
28 application.

29 (h) Midwest transplant network, with the approval of the director of  
30 vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall  
31 design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

32 (i) As a condition of receiving the donate life license plate and any  
33 subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must provide  
34 consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor vehicle  
35 record information, including the applicant's name, address, logo use  
36 royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to midwest  
37 transplant network and the state treasurer.

38 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers  
39 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance  
40 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon  
41 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire  
42 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the midwest transplant network  
43 royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be

1 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the midwest  
2 transplant network royalty fund shall be made in accordance with  
3 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports  
4 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state  
5 treasurer's designee. Payments from the midwest transplant network  
6 royalty fund to the appropriate designee of midwest transplant network  
7 shall be made on a monthly basis.

8 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-161 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-161. (a)  
9 Any disabled veteran as defined in K.S.A. 8-160, and amendments thereto,  
10 who resides in Kansas and who makes application to the director of  
11 vehicles on a form furnished by the director for registration of a motor  
12 vehicle that is a passenger vehicle ~~or~~, a truck with a gross weight of not  
13 more than 20,000 pounds, *or a motorcycle* and is owned or leased and  
14 used by such veteran may have such motor vehicle registered, and the  
15 director shall issue a distinctive license plate for it. Such license plate shall  
16 be issued for the same period of time as other license plates are issued.  
17 Such registration shall be made and such license plates issued free of  
18 charge to the disabled veteran. The director of vehicles shall also issue to  
19 the disabled veteran an individual identification card which must be  
20 carried by the disabled veteran when the motor vehicle being operated by  
21 the disabled veteran or used for the transportation of such disabled veteran  
22 is parked in a designated accessible parking space.

23 (b) Any Kansas resident who owns or leases a motor vehicle and who  
24 is responsible for the transportation of a disabled veteran or any resident  
25 disabled veteran desiring a distinctive license plate for a vehicle other than  
26 a motor vehicle owned or leased by the veteran may make application to  
27 the director of vehicles for such a license plate. Such license plate shall be  
28 issued for the same period of time as other license plates are issued. There  
29 shall be no fee for such license plates in addition to the regular registration  
30 fee.

31 (c) The director of vehicles shall design a special license plate to be  
32 issued as provided in this act. No registration or license plates issued under  
33 this act shall be transferable to any other person. No registration under this  
34 act shall be made until the applicant has filed with the director acceptable  
35 proof that the applicant is a disabled veteran as defined by K.S.A. 8-160,  
36 and amendments thereto, or is responsible for the transportation of such  
37 veteran. Motor vehicles displaying the distinctive license plates provided  
38 for in this act shall be permitted to park in any parking space on public or  
39 private property which is clearly marked as being reserved for the use of  
40 persons with a disability or persons responsible for the transportation of a  
41 person with a disability, except a parking space on private property which  
42 is clearly marked as being reserved for the use of a specified person with a  
43 disability, or park without charge in any metered zone and shall be exempt

1 from any time limitation imposed on parking in any zone designated for  
2 parking, during the hours in which parking is permitted in any city.

3 (d) Any person who willfully and falsely represents that such person  
4 has the qualifications to obtain the distinctive license plates provided for  
5 by this section, or who falsely utilizes the parking privilege accorded by  
6 this section, shall be guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by  
7 a fine of not more than \$250.

8 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2015, any owner or lessee of  
9 one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of  
10 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with  
11 the provisions of this section, may be issued one rotary international  
12 license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates  
13 shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper  
14 registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-  
15 143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county  
16 treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by rotary  
17 international or the presentation of the annual logo use authorization  
18 statement provided for in subsection (b).

19 (b) Rotary international may authorize the use of their logo to be  
20 affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment  
21 received pursuant to this section shall be used to support rotary  
22 international. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to  
23 rotary international for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and  
24 payment to either: (1) rotary international in an amount of not less than  
25 \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each license  
26 plate to be issued, rotary international shall issue to the motor vehicle  
27 owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement,  
28 which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time  
29 of registration; or (2) the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment  
30 for each license plate to be issued.

31 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may  
32 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such  
33 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished  
34 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall  
35 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
36 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment  
37 established by rotary international. Application for registration of a  
38 passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this  
39 section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the  
40 director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

41 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be  
42 transferable to any other person.

43 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer rotary international license

1 plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

2 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,  
3 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner  
4 prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No  
5 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant  
6 either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use  
7 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of  
8 the logo use royalty payment as established by rotary international. If such  
9 logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration  
10 or faxed by rotary international, or the annual logo use royalty payment is  
11 not made to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the applicant  
12 shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto,  
13 and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's  
14 residence.

15 (g) Rotary international shall:

16 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized  
17 by this section; and

18 (2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number  
19 where applicants can call rotary international for information concerning  
20 the application process or the status of their license plate application.

21 (h) Rotary international, with the approval of the director of vehicles  
22 and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a  
23 plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

24 (i) As a condition of receiving the rotary international license plate  
25 and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must  
26 provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor  
27 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address, logo  
28 use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to rotary  
29 international and the state treasurer.

30 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers  
31 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance  
32 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon  
33 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire  
34 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the rotary international royalty  
35 fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be  
36 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the rotary  
37 international royalty fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation  
38 acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant  
39 to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's  
40 designee. Payments from the rotary international royalty fund to the  
41 appropriate designee of the rotary international shall be made on a monthly  
42 basis.

43 New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2015, any owner or lessee of

1 one or more passenger vehicles, trailers or trucks registered for a gross  
2 weight of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon  
3 compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one Kansas  
4 horse council license plate for each such passenger vehicle, trailer or truck.  
5 Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates  
6 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided  
7 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the  
8 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by the Kansas  
9 horse council or the presentation of the annual logo use authorization  
10 statement provided for in subsection (b).

11 (b) The Kansas horse council may authorize the use of their logo to  
12 be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty  
13 payment received pursuant to this section shall be used to support the  
14 Kansas horse council. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may  
15 apply to the Kansas horse council for the use of such logo. Upon annual  
16 application and payment to either: (1) The Kansas horse council in an  
17 amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty  
18 payment for each license plate to be issued, the Kansas horse council shall  
19 issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo  
20 use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle  
21 owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the county treasurer of  
22 the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued.

23 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may  
24 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such  
25 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished  
26 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall  
27 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
28 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment  
29 established by the Kansas horse council. Application for registration of a  
30 passenger vehicle, trailer or truck and issuance of the license plate under  
31 this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed  
32 by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

33 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be  
34 transferable to any other person.

35 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer the Kansas horse council  
36 license plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

37 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,  
38 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner  
39 prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No  
40 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant  
41 either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use  
42 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of  
43 the logo use royalty payment as established by the Kansas horse council. If

1 such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of  
2 registration or faxed by the Kansas horse council, or the annual logo use  
3 royalty payment is not made to the county treasurer at the time of  
4 registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143,  
5 and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county  
6 treasurer of such person's residence.

7 (g) The Kansas horse council shall:

8 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized  
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11 where applicants can call the Kansas horse council for information  
12 concerning the application process or the status of their license plate  
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14 (h) The Kansas horse council, with the approval of the director of  
15 vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall  
16 design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

17 (i) As a condition of receiving the Kansas horse council license plate  
18 and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must  
19 provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor  
20 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address, logo  
21 use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the Kansas  
22 horse council and the state treasurer.

23 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers  
24 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance  
25 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon  
26 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire  
27 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Kansas horse council  
28 royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be  
29 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the Kansas horse  
30 council royalty fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts  
31 upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to  
32 vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee.  
33 Payments from the Kansas horse council royalty fund to the appropriate  
34 designee of the Kansas horse council shall be made on a monthly basis.
