AN ACT concerning the newborn infant protection act; relating to
anonymity of parent surrendering a child; amending K.S.A. 2013 Supp.
38-2282 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 38-2282 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 38-2282. (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the 8 newborn infant protection act.

9 (b) A parent or other person having lawful custody of an infant which 10 is 45 days old or younger and which has not suffered bodily harm may 11 surrender physical custody of the infant to any employee who is on duty at 12 a fire station, city or county health department or medical care facility as 13 defined by K.S.A. 65-425, and amendments thereto. Such employee shall take physical custody of an infant surrendered pursuant to this section. A 14 parent or other person voluntarily surrendering an infant under this 15 subsection shall not be required to reveal personally identifiable 16 information, but may be offered the opportunity to provide information 17 concerning the child's familial or medical history. 18

(c) A person or facility to whom a child is delivered pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to reveal the name or other personally identifiable information of the person who delivered the child unless there is a reasonable suspicion that the child has been abused, and such person or such facility shall be immune from civil or criminal liability for any action taken pursuant to this subsection.

25 (e)(d)As soon as possible after a person takes physical custody of an 26 infant under this section, such person shall notify a local law enforcement 27 agency that the person has taken physical custody of an infant pursuant to 28 this section. Upon receipt of such notice a law enforcement officer from 29 such law enforcement agency shall take custody of the infant as an 30 abandoned child. The law enforcement agency shall deliver the infant to a 31 facility or person designated by the secretary pursuant to K.S.A. 2013 32 Supp. 38-2232, and amendments thereto.

(e)(f) Upon request, all medical records of the infant shall be made 2 available to the department of social and rehabilitation services and given 3 to the person awarded custody of such infant. The medical facility 4 providing such records shall be immune from liability for such records 5 6 release. 7
