1 AN ACT concerning education; relating to capital outlay; making and
2 concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for
3 the department of education; amending K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 72-8814 and
4 repealing the existing section.

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*
7 New Section 1.

8 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

9 (a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general
10 fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, the following:

11 Supplemental general state aid.....\$103,865,000

12 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 72-8814 is hereby amended to read as
13 follows: 72-8814. (a) There is hereby established in the state treasury the
14 school district capital outlay state aid fund. Such fund shall consist of all
15 amounts transferred thereto under the provisions of subsection (c).

16 (b) In each school year, each school district which levies a tax
17 pursuant to K.S.A. 72-8801 et seq., and amendments thereto, shall be
18 entitled to receive payment from the school district capital outlay state aid
19 fund in an amount determined by the state board of education as provided
20 in this subsection. The state board of education shall:

21 (1) Determine the amount of the assessed valuation per pupil (AVPP)
22 of each school district in the state and round such amount to the nearest
23 \$1,000. The rounded amount is the AVPP of a school district for the
24 purposes of this section;

25 (2) determine the median AVPP of all school districts;

26 (3) prepare a schedule of dollar amounts using the amount of the
27 median AVPP of all school districts as the point of beginning. The
28 schedule of dollar amounts shall range upward in equal \$1,000 intervals
29 from the point of beginning to and including an amount that is equal to the
30 amount of the AVPP of the school district with the highest AVPP of all
31 school districts and shall range downward in equal \$1,000 intervals from
32 the point of beginning to and including an amount that is equal to the
33 amount of the AVPP of the school district with the lowest AVPP of all
34 school districts;

35 (4) determine a state aid percentage factor for each school district by
36 assigning a state aid computation percentage to the amount of the median

1 AVPP shown on the schedule, decreasing the state aid computation
2 percentage assigned to the amount of the median AVPP by one percentage
3 point for each \$1,000 interval above the amount of the median AVPP, and
4 increasing the state aid computation percentage assigned to the amount of
5 the median AVPP by one percentage point for each \$1,000 interval below
6 the amount of the median AVPP. Except as provided by K.S.A. 2013 Supp.
7 72-8814b, and amendments thereto, the state aid percentage factor of a
8 school district is the percentage assigned to the schedule amount that is
9 equal to the amount of the AVPP of the school district, except that the state
10 aid percentage factor of a school district shall not exceed 100%. The state
11 aid computation percentage is 25%;

12 (5) determine the amount levied by each school district pursuant to
13 K.S.A. 72-8801 et seq., and amendments thereto;

14 (6) multiply the amount computed under (5), but not to exceed 8
15 mills, by the applicable state aid percentage factor. The product is the
16 amount of payment the school district is entitled to receive from the school
17 district capital outlay state aid fund in the school year.

18 (c) The state board shall certify to the director of accounts and reports
19 the entitlements of school districts determined under the provisions of
20 subsection (b), and an amount equal thereto shall be transferred by the
21 director from the state general fund to the school district capital outlay
22 state aid fund for distribution to school districts, ~~except that no transfers~~
23 ~~shall be made from the state general fund to the school district capital~~
24 ~~outlay state aid fund during the fiscal years ending June 30, 2013, June 30,~~
25 ~~2014, June 30, 2015, or June 30, 2016.~~ All transfers made in accordance
26 with the provisions of this subsection shall be considered to be demand
27 transfers from the state general fund.

28 (d) Payments from the school district capital outlay state aid fund
29 shall be distributed to school districts at times determined by the state
30 board of education. The state board of education shall certify to the
31 director of accounts and reports the amount due each school district
32 entitled to payment from the fund, and the director of accounts and reports
33 shall draw a warrant on the state treasurer payable to the treasurer of the
34 school district. Upon receipt of the warrant, the treasurer of the school
35 district shall credit the amount thereof to the capital outlay fund of the
36 school district to be used for the purposes of such fund.

37 (e) Amounts transferred to the capital outlay fund of a school district
38 as authorized by K.S.A. 72-6433, and amendments thereto, shall not be
39 included in the computation when determining the amount of state aid to
40 which a district is entitled to receive under this section.

41 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 72-8814 is hereby repealed.

43 publication in the statute book.
