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1	AN ACT creating the Johnson county community college go pro now
2 3	program; making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years
3	ending June 30, 2014, June 30, 2015, and June 30, 2016, for the state
4	board of regents.
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6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
7	Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2014, June 30,
8	2015, and June 30, 2016, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and
9	limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement
10	projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing
11	are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.
12	(b) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of
13	K.S.A. 75-6702, and amendments thereto.
14	(c) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
15	provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

17	STATE BOARD OF REGENTS
18	(a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general
19	fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014, the following:
20	Johnson county community college go pro now\$500,000
21	Provided, That, during fiscal year 2014, notwithstanding the provisions of
22	any other statute, expenditures shall be made from the Johnson county
23	community college go pro now account of the state general fund for fiscal
24	year 2014 by the state board of regents to establish a pilot program called
25	the Johnson county community college go pro now program, that directly
26	benefits students, Kansas technology-driven employers and Kansas
27	bioscience employers by helping students attain their educational goals
28	and employers meet their technical and bioscience workforce needs:
29	Provided further, That development and implementation of the pilot
30	program seeks to provide high school students with an: (1) Accelerate IT,
31	two-year, opportunity to receive a high school diploma from the school
32	district in which the student is enrolled, and associate degree from Johnson
33	county community college, in the relevant technology or bioscience field
34	that addresses employers' needs; or (2) accelerated, four-year opportunity
35	to receive a high school diploma from the school district in which the
36	student is enrolled, associate degree from Johnson county community

1 college, and bachelor's degree from a state educational institution, as 2 defined in K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, in the relevant 3 technology or bioscience field that addresses employers' needs: And 4 provided further. That the objectives of the program are students graduate 5 from the program after achieving the competency objectives, identified collaboratively by the employers and the educational institutions, with an 6 7 opportunity, upon successful performance, of a high-paying job in the 8 workplace and no program-related tuition debt, and the employer benefits 9 from hiring an employee already prepared to succeed in the respective workplace who can be productive on the first day of the job: And provided 10 further, That the state board of regents, the administration of Johnson 11 12 county community college, the administration of the university of Kansas 13 Edwards campus, the administration of the Kansas state university Olathe 14 campus, the state board of education and any interested unified school 15 district shall collaborate to implement such program: And provided further, 16 That the course of study for students admitted into such program shall be 17 subject to the approval of the state board of education and shall be 18 designed to meet the high school graduation requirements for such 19 students: And provided further, That students admitted to the Johnson 20 county community college go pro now program may be charged fees by 21 Johnson county community college and the participating universities 22 which are no higher than those fees regularly charged to high school, 23 community college or university students, but shall not be charged tuition by Johnson county community college or a state educational institution: 24 25 And provided further. That it is anticipated that for fiscal year 2016, the 26 tuition for the students in this program shall be paid by the private sector 27 employers: And provided further, That the state board of regents shall 28 review the credit hours of course work in the program to determine 29 compliance with K.S.A. 71-601, and amendments thereto: And provided 30 further, That solely for the purpose of admission to the Johnson county 31 community college go pro now program, a student shall not be required to 32 comply with the requirements of K.S.A. 76-717, and amendments thereto.

33 (b) During fiscal year 2014 and fiscal year 2015, expenditures shall 34 be made from the Johnson county community college go pro now account 35 of the state general fund for fiscal year 2014 and fiscal year 2015 by the 36 state board of regents to establish a go pro now-accelerate IT advisory 37 board consisting of five members appointed as follows: One member by 38 the superintendents of the participating school districts, one member by the 39 Johnson county community college president and one member 40 representing the universities selected by the board of regents. Following 41 the appointments of these three board members, such board members shall 42 select two members from a group of applicants nominated by technology 43 or bioscience private sector employers. The go pro now-accelerate IT

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advisory board shall assist the participating school districts, Johnson
 county community college and the state educational institutions in
 curriculum design, student selection and retention, design and measures of
 student core competency requirements for graduation, internship program
 design and the overall operation of the program.

10 Johnson county community college go pro now......\$1,500,000 Provided, That any unencumbered balance in the Johnson county 11 12 community college go pro now account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 13 2014, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2015: Provided further, That, during fiscal year 2015, notwithstanding the provisions of any other 14 statute, expenditures shall be made from the Johnson county community 15 college go pro now account of the state general fund for fiscal year 2015 16 17 by the state board of regents to establish a pilot program called the 18 Johnson county community college go pro now program, that directly 19 benefits students, Kansas technology-driven employers and Kansas 20 bioscience employers by helping students attain their educational goals 21 and employers meet their technical and bioscience workforce needs: 22 Provided further, That development and implementation of the pilot 23 program seeks to provide high school students with an: (1) Accelerate IT, 24 two-year, opportunity to receive a high school diploma from the school 25 district in which the student is enrolled, and associate degree from Johnson 26 county community college, in the relevant technology or bioscience field 27 that addresses employers' needs; or (2) accelerated, four-year opportunity 28 to receive a high school diploma from the school district in which the 29 student is enrolled, associate degree from Johnson county community 30 college, and bachelor's degree from a state educational institution, as 31 defined in K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, in the relevant 32 technology or bioscience field that addresses employers' needs: And 33 provided further. That the objectives of the program are students graduate 34 from the program after achieving the competency objectives, identified 35 collaboratively by the employers and the educational institutions, with an 36 opportunity, upon successful performance, of a high-paying job in the 37 workplace and no program-related tuition debt, and the employer benefits 38 from hiring an employee already prepared to succeed in the respective 39 workplace who can be productive on the first day of the job: And provided 40 further, That the state board of regents, the administration of Johnson 41 county community college, the administration of the university of Kansas Edwards campus, the administration of the Kansas state university Olathe 42 43 campus, the state board of education and any interested unified school

1 district shall collaborate to implement such program: And provided further, 2 That the course of study for students admitted into such program shall be 3 subject to the approval of the state board of education and shall be 4 designed to meet the high school graduation requirements for such 5 students: And provided further, That students admitted to the Johnson county community college go pro now program may be charged fees by 6 7 Johnson county community college and the participating universities 8 which are no higher than those fees regularly charged to high school, community college or university students, but shall not be charged tuition 9 10 by Johnson county community college or a state educational institution: And provided further, That it is anticipated that for fiscal year 2016, the 11 12 tuition for the students in this program shall be paid by the private sector employers: And provided further. That the state board of regents shall 13 review the credit hours of course work in the program to determine 14 compliance with K.S.A. 71-601, and amendments thereto: And provided 15 16 *further,* That solely for the purpose of admission to the Johnson county 17 community college go pro now program, a student shall not be required to 18 comply with the requirements of K.S.A. 76-717, and amendments thereto.

(b) Any unencumbered balance in excess of \$100 as of June 30,
2015, for the above agency in the Johnson county community college go
pro now account of the state general fund is hereby reappropriated for
fiscal year 2016.
