### SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2436

# As Amended by House Committee on Vision 2020

### **Brief\***

HB 2436, as amended, would enact new law to permit the chairpersons of the Board of Cosmetology and the Board of Barbering to reach an agreement, approved by each board, to designate a single inspector from either board to inspect dual-licensed salons and barbershops.

Designated inspectors would perform all duties required by both boards and sanitation standards adopted by the Secretary of Health and Environment. Designated inspectors would be trained by both boards. Currently, dual-licensed salons and barber shops are inspected by inspectors from both boards.

## Background

The Board of Barbering and the Board of Cosmetology, testifying in support of the bill at the House Committee hearing, each stated the bill would remove duplicate inspections presently required.

There was no opponent testimony at the hearing.

The House Committee on Vision 2020 amended the bill by striking language that would have amended law applicable to the State Board of Cosmetology and replacing it with language creating a new statute having the same effect as the proposed amendment in the introduced version of the bill.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, as introduced, indicates the bill would not have an effect on the state's revenues or expenditures. The fiscal note also indicates there would be some savings from having duallicensed facilities inspected by a single agency, but neither agency can provide an estimate of savings until an agreement is reached.
