SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2582

As Recommended by House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources

Brief*

HB 2582 would establish an additional exception to the requirement for certain entities to obtain a valid license in order to engage in the business of conducting a food establishment or a food processing plant. The bill would permit nonprofit churches and other religious organizations sponsoring food sales to operate without licensure.

Background

At the House Committee hearing on the bill, the only conferee was Rep. Alcala who appeared as a proponent. Rep. Alcala told the Committee members that throughout the state there are nonprofit churches which conduct regular food sales to fund programs to create food or clothing banks. Rep. Alcala also stated that this would not exempt nonprofit churches or religious organizations from required inspections or rules and regulations when a violation is observed or reported.

The fiscal note on the bill indicates there would be no fiscal effect for the Department of Agriculture because the Department does not currently license or routinely inspect nonprofit churches or other religious organizations.
