SUBJECT: Corrected Fiscal Note for HB 2436 by Representative Merrick

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following corrected fiscal note concerning HB 2436 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2436 would require an applicant for a class M license who passes a driving examination administered by the Department of Revenue Division of Vehicles on a three-wheeled motorcycle to have a restriction placed on the applicant's license that limits the applicant to operate only a three-wheeled motorcycle. The provision would exclude autocycles. An applicant for a class M license who passes a driving examination administered by the Division on a two-wheeled motorcycle may operate any registered two-wheeled or three-wheeled motorcycle.

The Department of Revenue estimates HB 2436 would require costs totaling \$67,702. This amount includes \$59,836 for administrative costs, \$3,100 for printing manuals, \$2,400 for programming (\$30 per hour x 80 hours), and \$1,736 for testing. The administrative costs would include payments to the driver licensing car production vendor, updates to online and paper

driving manuals, and adding new restriction codes to reports. Payments to the driver licensing car production vendor for a prior law change totaled approximately \$55,000. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2436 is not reflected in *The FY 2017 Governor's Budget Report*.
