AN ACT concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; relating
 to calculation of criminal history; correction of sentence; amending
 K.S.A. 22-3504 and K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6810 and 21-6811 and
 repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

7 K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6810 is hereby amended to read as Section 1. 8 follows: 21-6810. (a) Criminal history categories contained in the 9 sentencing guidelines grids are based on the following types of prior convictions: Person felony adult convictions, nonperson felony adult 10 convictions, person felony juvenile adjudications, nonperson felony 11 12 juvenile adjudications, person misdemeanor adult convictions, nonperson 13 class A misdemeanor adult convictions, person misdemeanor juvenile 14 adjudications, nonperson class A misdemeanor juvenile adjudications, 15 select class B nonperson misdemeanor adult convictions, select class B 16 nonperson misdemeanor juvenile adjudications and convictions and 17 adjudications for violations of municipal ordinances or county resolutions 18 which are comparable to any crime classified under the state law of 19 Kansas as a person misdemeanor, select nonperson class B misdemeanor 20 or nonperson class A misdemeanor. A prior conviction is any conviction, 21 other than another count in the current case which was brought in the same information or complaint or which was joined for trial with other counts in 22 23 the current case pursuant to K.S.A. 22-3203, and amendments thereto, 24 which occurred prior to sentencing in the current case regardless of 25 whether the offense that led to the prior conviction occurred before or after 26 the current offense or the conviction in the current case.

(b) A class B nonperson select misdemeanor is a special classification
 established for weapons violations. Such classification shall be considered
 and scored in determining an offender's criminal history classification.

(c) Except as otherwise provided, all convictions, whether sentenced
 consecutively or concurrently, shall be counted separately in the offender's
 criminal history.

(d) Except as provided in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6815, and
 amendments thereto, the following are applicable to determining an
 offender's criminal history classification:

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(1) Only verified convictions will be considered and scored.

1 (2) All prior adult felony convictions, including expungements, will 2 be considered and scored. *Prior adult felony convictions that were* 3 *committed before July 1, 1993, shall be scored as a person or nonperson* 4 *crime using an existing comparable offense under the Kansas criminal* 5 *code;*

- (3) There will be no decay factor applicable for:
- (A) Adult convictions;

8 (B) a juvenile adjudication for an offense which would constitute a 9 person felony if committed by an adult. *Prior juvenile adjudications that* 10 *were committed before July 1, 1993, shall be scored as a person or* 11 *nonperson crime using an existing comparable offense under the Kansas* 12 *criminal code*;

13 (C) a juvenile adjudication for an offense committed before July 1,
14 1993, which would have been a class A, B or C felony, if committed by an
15 adult; or

16 (D) a juvenile adjudication for an offense committed on or after July 17 1, 1993, which would be an off-grid felony, a nondrug severity level 1, 2, 18 3, 4 or 5 felony, a drug severity level 1, 2 or 3 felony for an offense 19 committed on or after July 1, 1993, but prior to July 1, 2012, or a drug 20 severity level 1, 2, 3 or 4 felony for an offense committed on or after July 21 1, 2012, if committed by an adult.

(4) Except as otherwise provided, a juvenile adjudication will decay
if the current crime of conviction is committed after the offender reaches
the age of 25, and the juvenile adjudication is for an offense:

(A) Committed before July 1, 1993, which would have been a class D
or E felony if committed by an adult;

(B) committed on or after July 1, 1993, which would be a nondrug
severity level 6, 7, 8, 9 or 10, a drug severity level 4 felony for an offense
committed on or after July 1, 1993, but prior to July 1, 2012, or a drug
severity level 5 felony for an offense committed on or after July 1, 2012, if
committed by an adult; or

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(C) which would be a misdemeanor if committed by an adult.

(5) All person misdemeanors, class A nonperson misdemeanors and
 class B select nonperson misdemeanors, and all municipal ordinance and
 county resolution violations comparable to such misdemeanors, shall be
 considered and scored.

(6) Unless otherwise provided by law, unclassified felonies and
misdemeanors, shall be considered and scored as nonperson crimes for the
purpose of determining criminal history.

40 (7) Prior convictions of a crime defined by a statute which has since
41 been repealed shall be scored using the classification assigned at the time
42 of such conviction.

(8) Prior convictions of a crime defined by a statute which has since

been determined unconstitutional by an appellate court shall not be used
 for criminal history scoring purposes.

3 (9) Prior convictions of any crime shall not be counted in determining 4 the criminal history category if they enhance the severity level, elevate the 5 classification from misdemeanor to felony, or are elements of the present 6 crime of conviction. Except as otherwise provided, all other prior 7 convictions will be considered and scored.

8 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6811 is hereby amended to read as 9 follows: 21-6811. In addition to the provisions of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-0 6810, and amendments thereto, the following shall apply in determining an 11 offender's criminal history classification as contained in the presumptive 12 sentencing guidelines grids:

13 (a) Every three prior adult convictions or juvenile adjudications of class A and class B person misdemeanors in the offender's criminal history, 14 or any combination thereof, shall be rated as one adult conviction or one 15 16 juvenile adjudication of a person felony for criminal history purposes. Every three prior adult convictions or juvenile adjudications of assault as 17 18 defined in K.S.A. 21-3408, prior to its repeal, or-subsection (a) of K.S.A. 19 2014 Supp. 21-5412(a), and amendments thereto, occurring within a 20 period commencing three years prior to the date of conviction for the 21 current crime of conviction shall be rated as one adult conviction or one 22 juvenile adjudication of a person felony for criminal history purposes.

23 (b) A conviction of criminal possession of a firearm as defined in 24 subsection (a)(1) or (a)(5) of K.S.A. 21-4204(a)(1) or (a)(5), prior to its 25 repeal, criminal use of weapons as defined in subsection (a)(10) or (a)(11)of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6301(a)(10) or (a)(11), and amendments thereto, 26 27 or unlawful possession of a firearm as in effect on June 30, 2005, and as 28 defined in K.S.A. 21-4218, prior to its repeal, will be scored as a select class B nonperson misdemeanor conviction or adjudication and shall not 29 30 be scored as a person misdemeanor for criminal history purposes.

(c) (1) If the current crime of conviction was committed before July
1, 1996, and is for subsection (b) of K.S.A. 21-3404(b), as in effect on
June 30, 1996, involuntary manslaughter in the commission of driving
under the influence, then, each prior adult conviction or juvenile
adjudication for K.S.A. 8-1567, and amendments thereto, shall count as
one person felony for criminal history purposes.

37 (2) If the current crime of conviction was committed on or after July 38 1, 1996, and is for a violation of subsection (a)(3) of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 39 21-5405(a)(3), and amendments thereto, each prior adult conviction, 40 diversion in lieu of criminal prosecution or juvenile adjudication for: (A) 41 An act described in K.S.A. 8-1567, and amendments thereto; or (B) a 42 violation of a law of another state or an ordinance of any city, or resolution 43 of any county, which prohibits the act described in K.S.A. 8-1567, and amendments thereto, shall count as one person felony for criminal history
 purposes.

3 (d) Prior burglary adult convictions and juvenile adjudications will be 4 scored for criminal history purposes as follows:

5 (1) As a prior person felony if the prior conviction or adjudication 6 was classified as a burglary as defined in subsection (a) of K.S.A. 21-7 3715(*a*), prior to its repeal, or subsection (a)(1) of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-5807(*a*)(1), and amendments thereto.

9 (2) As a prior nonperson felony if the prior conviction or adjudication 10 was classified as a burglary as defined in subsection (b) or (c) of K.S.A. 11 21-3715(b) or (c), prior to its repeal, or subsection (a)(2) or (a)(3) of 12 K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-5807(a)(2) or (a)(3), and amendments thereto.

13 The facts required to classify prior burglary adult convictions and 14 juvenile adjudications shall be established by the state by a preponderance 15 of the evidence.

16 (e) Out-of-state convictions and juvenile adjudications shall be used 17 in classifying the offender's criminal history. An out-of-state crime will be 18 classified as either a felony or a misdemeanor according to the convicting jurisdiction. If a crime is a felony in another state, it will be counted as a 19 20 felony in Kansas. The state of Kansas shall classify the crime as person or 21 nonperson. In designating a crime as person or nonperson existing 22 comparable offenses under the Kansas criminal code shall be referred to. 23 If the state of Kansas does not have a *an existing* comparable offense, the 24 out-of-state conviction shall be classified as a nonperson crime. 25 Convictions or adjudications occurring within the federal system, other state systems, the District of Columbia, foreign, tribal or military courts 26 27 are considered out-of-state convictions or adjudications. The facts required 28 to classify out-of-state adult convictions and juvenile adjudications shall 29 be established by the state by a preponderance of the evidence.

(f) Except as provided in subsections (d)(4), (d)(5) or (d)(6) of K.S.A. 21-4710(d)(4), (d)(5) and (d)(6), prior to its repeal, or subsections (d)(3)(B), (d)(3)(C), (d)(3)(D) and (d)(4) of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6810(d)(3) (B), (d)(3)(C), (d)(3)(D) and (d)(4), and amendments thereto, juvenile adjudications will be applied in the same manner as adult convictions. Out-of-state juvenile adjudications will be treated as juvenile adjudications in Kansas.

(g) A prior felony conviction of an attempt, a conspiracy or a solicitation as provided in K.S.A. 21-3301, 21-3302 or 21-3303, prior to their repeal, or K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-5301, 21-5302 or 21-5303, and amendments thereto, to commit a crime shall be treated as a person or nonperson crime in accordance with the designation assigned to the underlying crime.

43 (h) Drug crimes are designated as nonperson crimes for criminal

1 history scoring.

2 (i) If the current crime of conviction is for a violation of subsections 3 (b)(2) through (b)(4) of K.S.A. 8-1602(b)(3) through (b)(5), and 4 amendments thereto, each of the following prior convictions committed on 5 or after July 1, 2011, shall count as a person felony for criminal history 6 purposes: K.S.A. 8-235, 8-262, 8-287, 8-291, 8-1566, 8-1567, 8-1568, 8-7 1602, 8-1605 and 40-3104, and amendments thereto, and subsection (a)(3)8 of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-5405(a)(3) and 21-5406, and amendments 9 thereto, or a violation of a city ordinance or law of another state which 10 would also constitute a violation of such sections.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 22-3504 is hereby amended to read as follows: 22-11 12 3504.-(1) (a) The court may correct an illegal sentence-at any time as provided in subsection (c). The defendant shall receive full credit for time 13 spent in custody under the sentence prior to correction. Unless the motion 14 15 and the files and records of the case conclusively show that the defendant 16 is not entitled to relief, the defendant shall have a right to a hearing, after reasonable notice to be fixed by the court, to be personally present and to 17 18 have the assistance of counsel in any proceeding for the correction of an 19 illegal sentence.

(2) (b) Clerical mistakes in judgments, orders or other parts of the
 record and errors in the record arising from oversight or omission may be
 corrected by the court at any time and after such notice, if any, as the court
 orders.

24 (c) (1) Any motion under subsection (a) must be brought within one 25 year of:

(A) The final order of the last appellate court in this state to exercise
 jurisdiction on a direct appeal or the termination of such appellate
 jurisdiction; or

(B) the denial of a petition for writ of certiorari to the United States
supreme court or issuance of such court's final order following the
granting of such petition.

(2) The time limitations herein may be extended by the court only to
prevent a manifest injustice concerning why the motion was not timely
filed. Manifest injustice does not include a sentence that is imposed in
compliance with the appellate case law existing at the time of sentencing.

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the Kansas register.
