## HOUSE BILL No. 2460

By Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

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AN ACT concerning the Kansas offender registration act; regarding violations of the act; amending K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 22-4903 and 2 3 repealing the existing section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 22-4903 is hereby amended to read as 6 7 follows: 22-4903.(a) Violation of the Kansas offender registration act is the failure by an offender, as defined in K.S.A. 22-4902, and amendments 8 9 thereto, to comply with any and all provisions of such act, including any and all duties set forth in K.S.A. 22-4905 through 22-4907, and 10 11 amendments thereto. Any violation of the Kansas offender registration act 12 which continues for more than 30 consecutive days shall, upon the 31st 13 consecutive day, constitute a new and separate offense, and shall continue to constitute a new and separate offense every 30 days thereafter for as 14 15 long as the violation continues.

16 (b) Aggravated violation of the Kansas offender registration act is violation of the Kansas offender registration act which continues for more 17 than 180 consecutive days. Any aggravated violation of the Kansas 18 19 offender registration act which continues for more than 180 consecutive 20 days shall, upon the 181<sup>st</sup> consecutive day, constitute a new and separate 21 offense, and shall continue to constitute a new and separate violation of the 22 Kansas offender registration act every 30 days thereafter, or a new and 23 separate aggravated violation of the Kansas offender registration act every 24 180 days thereafter, for as long as the violation continues.

25 (c) (1) Except as provided in subsection (c)(3), violation of the 26 Kansas offender registration act is:

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(A) Upon a first conviction, a severity level 6, person felony;

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upon a second conviction, a severity level 5, person felony; and (B)

29 (C) upon a third or subsequent conviction, a severity level 3, person 30 felony.

31 Such violation shall be designated as a person or nonperson crime in 32 accordance with the designation assigned to the underlying crime for which the offender is required to be registered under the Kansas offender 33 34 registration act. If the offender is required to be registered under both a person and nonperson underlying crime, the violation shall be 35 designated as a person crime. 36

1 (2) Except as provided in subsection (c)(3), aggravated violation of 2 the Kansas offender registration act is a severity level 3, person felony.

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Such violation shall be designated as a person or nonperson crime in 4 accordance with the designation assigned to the underlying crime for 5 which the offender is required to be registered under the Kansas offender 6 registration act. If the offender is required to be registered under both 7 a person and nonperson underlying crime, the violation shall be 8 designated as a person crime.

(3) Violation of the Kansas offender registration act or aggravated 9 violation of the Kansas offender registration act consisting only of failing 10 to remit payment to the sheriff's office as required in subsection (k) of 11 12 K.S.A. 22-4905(k), and amendments thereto, is:

13 (A) Except as provided in subsection (c)(3)(B), a class A misdemeanor if, within 15 days of registration, full payment is not 14 remitted to the sheriff's office; 15

16 (B) a severity level 9<del>, person</del> felony if, within 15 days of the most 17 recent registration, two or more full payments have not been remitted to 18 the sheriff's office.

19 Such violation shall be designated as a person or nonperson crime in accordance with the designation assigned to the underlying crime for 20 21 which the offender is required to be registered under the Kansas offender 22 registration act. If the offender is required to be registered under both 23 a person and nonperson underlying crime, the violation shall be 24 designated as a person crime.

(d) Prosecution of violations of this section may be held:

(1) In any county in which the offender resides;

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27 (2) in any county in which the offender is required to be registered 28 under the Kansas offender registration act;

29 (3) in any county in which the offender is located during which time 30 the offender is not in compliance with the Kansas offender registration act; 31 or

32 (4) in the county in which any conviction or adjudication occurred for 33 which the offender is required to be registered under the Kansas offender 34 registration act.

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Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 22-4903 is hereby repealed.
