AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;
 providing for the Korean war, operation desert storm, operation Iraqi
 freedom and operation enduring freedom license plates; amending
 K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1,141 and 8-1,147 and repealing the existing
 sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

8 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2016, any owner or lessee 9 of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of the state of Kansas, and 10 who submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance 11 12 with rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such 13 person is a veteran of the Korean war, upon compliance with the 14 provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for 15 each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person 16 as a veteran of the Korean war. Such license plates shall be issued for the 17 same period of time as other license plates upon proper registration and 18 payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and 19 amendments thereto.

20 (b) Any person who is a veteran of the Korean war may make 21 application for such distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to 22 such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and 23 furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive 24 license plates shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall 25 require that the applicant is a veteran of the Korean war. Application for 26 the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle and issuance of 27 the license plates under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee 28 in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by 29 the director.

30 (c) No registration or distinctive license plates issued under the 31 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

(d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such 1 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-

143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates tothe county treasurer of such person's residence.

4 New Sec. 2. (a) On and after January 1, 2016, any owner or lessee of 5 one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds 6 or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of the state of Kansas, and who 7 submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with 8 rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person 9 is a veteran of operation desert storm, upon compliance with the 10 provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person 11 12 as a veteran of operation desert storm. Such license plates shall be issued 13 for the same period of time as other license plates upon proper registration 14 and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and 15 amendments thereto.

16 (b) Any person who is a veteran of operation desert storm may make 17 application for such distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to 18 such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive 19 20 license plates shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall 21 require that the applicant is a veteran of operation desert storm. 22 Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle 23 and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be made by the 24 owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon 25 forms furnished by the director.

(c) No registration or distinctive license plates issued under theauthority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

28 (d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 29 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 30 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 31 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant 32 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such 33 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-34 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to 35 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

36 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2016, any owner or lessee of 37 one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds 38 or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of the state of Kansas, and who 39 submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with 40 rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person 41 is a veteran of operation Iraqi freedom, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for 42 43 each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person

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as a veteran of operation Iraqi freedom. Such license plates shall be issued
 for the same period of time as other license plates upon proper registration
 and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and
 amendments thereto.

5 (b) Any person who is a veteran of operation Iraqi freedom may make 6 application for such distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to 7 such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and 8 furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive 9 license plates shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a veteran of operation Iraqi freedom. 10 Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle 11 and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be made by the 12 13 owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon 14 forms furnished by the director.

15 (c) No registration or distinctive license plates issued under the 16 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

17 (d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 18 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 19 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 20 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant 21 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such 22 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-23 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to the county treasurer of such person's residence. 24

25 New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2016, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds 26 27 or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of the state of Kansas, and who 28 submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with 29 rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person 30 is a veteran of operation enduring freedom, upon compliance with the 31 provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for 32 each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person 33 as a veteran of operation enduring freedom. Such license plates shall be 34 issued for the same period of time as other license plates upon proper 35 registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-36 143, and amendments thereto.

(b) Any person who is a veteran of operation enduring freedom may make application for such distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a veteran of operation enduring freedom. Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or 1 motorcycle and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be 2 made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of 3 vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

4 (c) No registration or distinctive license plates issued under the 5 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

6 (d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 7 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 8 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 9 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant 10 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-11 12 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to 13 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized license plate fee prescribed by <u>subsection (c) of K.S.A. 8-132(c)</u>, and amendments thereto. This section shall not apply to any distinctive license plate authorized prior to July 1, 1994.

(b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive license
plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless there is a
guarantee of an initial issuance of at least 500 license plates.

(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive license
plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, or K.S.A. 2014 Supp.
8-177d, 8-1,163-or, 8-1,166, sections 1, 2, 3 or 4, and amendments thereto.

(d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive
license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148,
and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1,153, 8-1,158 or 81,161, and amendments thereto.

30 (e) The provisions of subsection (f) shall not apply to distinctive 31 license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1,160, 32 and amendments thereto, except that the division shall delay the 33 manufacturing and issuance of such distinctive license plate until the 34 division has received not less than 1,000 orders for such plate, including 35 payment of the personalized license plate fee required under subsection 36 (a). Upon certification by the director of vehicles to the director of 37 accounts and reports that not less than 1,000 paid orders for such plate 38 have been received, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer 39 \$40,000 from the state highway fund to the distinctive license plate fund.

40 (f) (1) Any person or organization sponsoring any distinctive license
41 plate authorized by the legislature on and after July 1, 2004, shall submit
42 to the division of vehicles a nonrefundable amount not to exceed \$20,000,
43 to defray the division's cost for developing such distinctive license plate.

1 (2) All moneys received under this subsection shall be remitted by the 2 secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the 3 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of 4 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in 5 the state treasury to the credit of the distinctive license plate fund which is 6 hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the distinctive 7 license plate fund shall be used by the department of revenue only for the 8 purpose associated with the development of distinctive license plates. All 9 expenditures from the distinctive license plate application fee fund shall be 10 made in accordance with appropriation acts, upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 11 12 secretary of the department of revenue.

(g) (1) Except for educational institution license plates issued under
 K.S.A. 8-1,142, and amendments thereto, the director of vehicles shall
 discontinue the issuance of any distinctive license plate authorized prior to
 July 1, 2004, and which is subject to the provisions of subsection (b) if:

(A) Less than 500 license plates, including annual renewals, areissued for that distinctive license plate by July 1, 2006; and

(B) less than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are issued
 for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year period
 after July 1, 2006.

(2) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of anydistinctive license plate authorized on and after July 1, 2004, if:

(A) Less than 500 plates, including annual renewals, are issued forthat distinctive license plate by the end of the second year of sales; and

(B) less than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are issued
 for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year period.

28 (h) An application for any distinctive license plate issued after 29 December 31, 2012, and the corresponding royalty fee may be collected either by the county treasurer or the entity benefiting from the issuance of 30 31 the distinctive license plate. Annual royalty payments collected by the 32 county treasurers shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt 33 34 of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount 35 in the state treasury to the credit of a segregated royalty fund which shall 36 be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the royalty 37 fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of 38 the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved 39 by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. Payments from the 40 royalty fund shall be made to the entity benefiting from the issuance of the 41 distinctive license plate on a monthly basis.

42 (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for any distinctive43 license plate, the division shall produce such distinctive license plate for a

motorcycle upon request to the division by the organization sponsoring the
 distinctive license plate.

3 (j) In addition to any residency requirements for all distinctive license 4 plates, any person not a resident of Kansas, serving as a member of the 5 armed forces stationed in this state shall be eligible to apply for any 6 distinctive license plate as if the individual was a resident of this state. 7 Such person shall be eligible to renew the distinctive license plate 8 registration as long as the person is still stationed in this state at the time 9 the registration is renewed.

10 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1,147 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1,147. In the event of the death of any person issued distinctive 11 12 license plates under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-161, 8-177a, 8-177c, 8-1,139, 8-1,140, 8-1,145 or 8-1,146 or K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-177d, 8-1,163 13 or, 8-1,166, sections 1, 2, 3 or 4, and amendments thereto, the surviving 14 15 spouse or other family member, if there is no surviving spouse, shall be 16 entitled to possession of any such distinctive license plates. Such license 17 plates shall not be displayed on any vehicle unless otherwise authorized by 18 statute.

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Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1,141 and 8-1,147 are hereby repealed.
