## SENATE BILL No. 243

1 AN ACT concerning the state civil service board; transferred from the 2 department of administration to the office of administrative hearings; 3 amending K.S.A. 75-2929b, 75-2929g and 75-3746 and K.S.A. 2014 4 Supp. 75-2929d and repealing the existing sections. 5 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 7 K.S.A. 75-2929b is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-Section 1. 8 2929b. (a) The board shall be attached to the department of administration office of administrative hearings and shall be within the department office 9 of administrative hearings as a part thereof. All budgeting, purchasing and 10 related management functions of the board shall be administered under the 11 12 direction and supervision of the-secretary of administration director of 13 administrative hearings. All vouchers for expenditures and all payrolls of 14 the board shall be approved by the chairperson of the board or a person or persons designated by such chairperson and the secretary of administration 15 16 director of administrative hearings or a person or persons designated by 17 such-secretary director. 18 (b) The board shall organize annually by electing one of its members 19 as chairperson and one as vice-chairperson. The board shall meet regularly 20 at least once each calendar quarter and special meetings may be called by 21 the chairperson or by a majority of the board. A quorum of the board shall 22 consist of three members. No action may be taken by the board without the 23 affirmative vote of at least three members. In the holding of hearings of 24 appeals by employees or appointing authorities pursuant to the Kansas 25 civil service act, the board may delegate to one or more of its members the 26 authority to serve as a hearing examiner for such a hearing, but action 27 upon any such appeal shall require the concurrence of at least three 28 members of the board. 29 (c) Meetings of the board shall be open to the public and no meeting 30 or hearing of the board shall be held unless at least three members of the 31 board are present. The director of personnel services administrative 32 hearings shall act as secretary of the board or may designate a person to 33 serve as the secretary of the board. The board shall keep records and 34 minutes of its business and official actions, and such records and minutes 35 shall be public records open to public inspection, subject to rules and 36 regulations specifying the hours and conditions of inspection. The director

1 of administrative hearings shall be the legal custodian of such records and 2 shall have the duty to store and maintain such records in order to carry

3 out the official business of the board and respond to inquiries regarding
4 the business and official actions of the board.

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5 (d) Each member of the state civil service board attending meetings 6 of such board, attending a subcommittee meeting-thereof authorized by 7 such board, or serving as hearing examiner at a hearing under the Kansas 8 civil service act shall be paid per diem compensation of \$70 and shall be 9 paid subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto. In addition, each member, who 10 resides more than 100 miles from the location of an authorized meeting or 11 12 hearing, shall receive per diem compensation of \$35 for each day in travel 13 to or from such meeting or hearing if such travel is on a day other than the 14 day or days of such meeting or hearing.

15 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 75-2929d is hereby amended to read as 16 follows: 75-2929d. (a) The state civil service board shall hear appeals taken to it pursuant to: (1) K.S.A. 75-2940, 75-2949 and 75-3747, and 17 18 amendments thereto, concerning demotion, dismissal or suspension of a 19 permanent employee in the classified service, or concerning refusal to 20 examine an applicant or to certify a person as eligible for a job class; and 21 (2) K.S.A. 75-2973, and amendments thereto, concerning disciplinary 22 action in violation of that statute.

23 (b) When an appeal is taken to the board, the board shall establish a 24 time and a place for the hearing which shall be held within 45 days after 25 receipt of request for the appeal. The board shall notify the person bringing the appeal and the appointing authority or other person whose action is 26 being reviewed of the time and the place of the hearing at least 14 days 27 28 prior to such hearing. Each party at the hearing shall have the right to be 29 represented by a person of the party's own choice. Hearings shall be 30 conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative 31 procedure act. For purposes of the administrative procedure act, the state 32 civil service board shall be deemed the agency head. The board may 33 affirm, modify or reverse an agency action and order any other action it 34 deems appropriate.

35 (c) The board, or the director of personnel services administrative 36 hearings when authorized by majority vote of the board, may depose 37 witnesses. Either party to a hearing may depose witnesses in accordance 38 with the Kansas administrative procedure act. If books and papers are 39 required to be produced in advance of a hearing date, the person or agency 40 producing the books and papers shall be entitled to receive reasonable 41 compensation to recover all costs of such production from the person or 42 agency for which they are produced. The board, any presiding officer or 43 the director of administrative hearings may examine such public records as may be required in relation to any matter which the board has authority
 to investigate.

3 (d) Each person not in the classified or unclassified service who 4 appears before the board or the director of administrative hearings by 5 order shall receive for such person's attendance the fees and mileage 6 provided for witnesses in civil actions in the district court. Such fees and 7 mileage shall be audited and paid by the state upon presentation of proper 8 vouchers. Each witness subpoenaed at the request of parties other than the 9 board or the director of administrative hearings shall be entitled to 10 compensation from the state for attendance or travel only if the board certifies that the testimony of such witness was relevant and material to the 11 12 matter investigated or, if such witness is not called to testify, the board 13 determines and certifies that such compensation should be paid.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 75-2929g is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-2929g. The secretary of administration, upon recommendation of the director of personnel services *administrative hearings* and the board, may adopt rules and regulations as provided in K.S.A. 75-3706, and amendments thereto, to carry out the provisions of K.S.A. 75-2929d to 75-2929g,-inclusive, and 75-2949d to 75-2949f,-inclusive, and amendments thereto.

21 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 75-3746 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-22 3746. The director of personnel services shall:

(a) Require the development of effective personnel administration
within all agencies in the state and make available the facilities of the
division of personnel services to this end.

(b) Keep in the office of the division of personnel services an official roster of the state civil service showing the employment history of each and every person who has been appointed to, employed, promoted, reduced or reinstated in any position in such service. The director of personnel services shall have access to all public records and papers, the examination of which will aid in the discharge of the director's duty in connection with this roster.

(c) Prepare, in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas civil
service act and rules and regulations adopted thereunder as provided in
K.S.A. 75-3706, and amendments thereto, examinations, eligible lists and
ratings of candidates for appointment.

37 (d) Make certification for appointment within the classified service,38 in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas civil service act.

(e) Make investigations concerning all matters touching the
enforcement and effect of the provisions of the Kansas civil service act and
rules and regulations adopted thereunder as provided in K.S.A. 75-3706,
and amendments thereto.

43 (f) Make an annual report to the secretary of administration, the

1 legislature and the governor regarding the activities of the division.

2 (g)—Attend or designate a representative to attend all meetings of the 3 state civil service board.

4 (h) Prepare and recommend to the secretary of administration rules 5 and regulations suitable for adoption as provided in K.S.A. 75-3706, and 6 amendments thereto, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the 7 Kansas civil service act. Such rules and regulations shall provide, among 8 other things, for current records of efficiency for methods of regular 9 distribution of communication materials; the manner of completing appointments and promotions; the rejection of eligible candidates; 10 competitive examinations; creation of eligible lists with successful 11 12 candidates ranked according to their rating in the examinations; leave of absence with and without pay; transfers, reinstatements, layoffs, vacations 13 and public notice of examinations; procedure for changes in rates of pay; 14 hours of work and other conditions of employment; the establishment of 15 16 programs, including trainee programs, designed to attract and utilize 17 persons with limited qualifications, but with potential for development, in 18 order to provide career development opportunities; establishment of a plan 19 for resolving employee grievances and complaints; development and operation of programs to improve work effectiveness, including 20 21 orientation, on-the-job training, supervisory training, managerial 22 development, safety, fringe benefit counseling and employee relations; and 23 the establishment of policies regarding manpower allocation and control.

27 (i) (i) Administer the Kansas civil service act.

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 75-2929b, 75-2929g and 75-3746 and K.S.A. 2014
Supp. 75-2929d are hereby repealed.
