AN ACT enacting the Kansas zero-based budget law; relating to zero-based budget review of state agencies.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. The provisions of sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas zero-based budget law.

Sec. 2. There is hereby established the joint budget review committee which shall consist of five senators and six members of the house of representatives. The president of the senate, the speaker of the house, minority leader of the senate and the minority leader of the house of representatives shall appoint the members of the joint budget review committee. The two major political parties shall have proportional representation on the joint budget review committee. If proportional representation results in a fraction, the party having a fraction exceeding 0.5 shall receive representation as though such fraction were a whole number. A quorum of the committee shall be six. Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, all actions of the committee may be taken by a majority of those present when there is a quorum. After the adjournment of each regular session of the legislature, the joint budget review committee shall organize by electing a chairperson and a vice-chairperson who are not members of the same house of the legislature. The vicechairperson shall exercise all of the powers of the chairperson in the absence of the chairperson. The joint budget review committee may meet at any time, and at any place in the state on the call of the chairperson. The committee may introduce such legislation as it deems necessary in performing its duties. Members of the joint budget review committee shall receive compensation, travel expenses and subsistence expenses and allowances as provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto.

- Sec. 3. (a) The Joint budget review committee shall conduct a zero-based budget review process under which each state agency named in this act shall submit a zero-based budget. The zero-based budget review shall be conducted on a 10-year cycle commencing with the first zero-based budget proposals submitted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.
- (b) The zero-based budget proposal created by each state agency pursuant to this section shall contain information fulfilling all of the

following criteria:

- (1) An assessment of the mission, vision, goals, priority objectives and core functions of the agency;
- (2) a description of each activity performed for which an appropriation is requested;
- (3) the legal basis for performing each activity for which an appropriation is requested;
- (4) the benefits and consequences of each agency activity for which an appropriation is requested;
- (5) a calculation of the cost of each agency activity and a justification of each dollar spent;
- (6) an itemized justification for the amount requested to perform each agency activity for which appropriation is requested; and
- (7) a prioritized list of each agency activity for which appropriation is requested.
- (c) As used in this act, "zero-based budget" means determining a budget by starting with a base of zero dollars and adding dollar amounts necessary to conduct specific activities and operations.
- Sec. 4. The legislative post audit committee shall direct the division of post audit to conduct a performance audit of each state agency and office, which is subject to review under this act. In conducting any such performance audit, the post auditor may include any areas of study related to agencies or offices subject to abolition as requested by the joint budget review committee. The audit shall be in accordance with article 11 of chapter 46 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto. The audit report on any agency or office being reviewed shall be completed by July 1 of the fiscal year preceding the review of such agency or office.
- Sec. 5. (a) During the review of a state agency or office under this act, the joint budget review committee shall hold a public hearing on such agency or office. The joint budget review committee shall receive testimony from the public, the state agency or officer involved and other appropriate state officers. The committee shall also consider any performance audit created by the division of post audit under section 4, and amendments thereto. In all such hearings, the state agency or officer involved shall provide any suggestions which would increase the efficiency or effectiveness of the administration or operation of the state agency or office.
- (b) In such public hearings, the committee shall take into consideration the following factors, if applicable, in developing its recommendations:
- (1) Whether the absence of the state agency or office or of any program, function or duty thereof would significantly harm or endanger the public health, safety or welfare;

(2) whether there is a reasonable relationship between the exercise of the police power of the state by the state agency or office and the protection of the public health, safety or welfare;

- (3) whether there is another less restrictive method of regulation available which could adequately protect the public;
- (4) whether regulation, administration of the program or performance of the function or duty by the state agency or office has the effect of directly or indirectly increasing the cost of any goods or services involved, and, if so, to what degree;
- (5) whether the increase in cost is more harmful to the public than the harm which could result from the absence of regulation, administration of the program or performance of the function or duty by the state agency or office;
- (6) whether all facets of the regulatory or administrative process are designed solely for the purpose of the protection of public interests and have such protection as a primary effect;
- (7) whether the purposes of the state agency or office or of any program, function or duty thereof can be accomplished in a more efficient, effective or economical manner;
- (8) whether the agency or office has a clear mission, goal or objective or is designed to address a problem and the extent to which the mission, goal or objective has been achieved or the problem has been addressed;
- (9) whether the agency or office is engaging in any activity not required by statute and the extent to which such activity is needed;
- (10) whether the agency or office is properly using its authority relating to fees, inspections, enforcement and penalties;
- (11) whether the agency or office and the programs administered by the agency or office overlap or duplicate those of other agencies or offices, the extent to which the agency or office coordinates with those agencies or offices, and the extent to which the programs administered by the agency or office can be consolidated with the programs of other state agencies or offices;
- (12) whether the agency or office is affected by federal intervention or loss of federal funds if the functions or duties of the agency or office are changed; and
- (13) whether the purpose and effectiveness of reporting requirements imposed on the agency or office justifies the continuation of the reporting requirement.
- (c) On or before December 31 of the year of the budget review of a state agency or office, the joint budget review committee shall develop a recommendation regarding the budget of such state agency or office, and shall introduce legislation to carry out any statutory changes necessary to cause such agency or office to operate more efficiently or effectively.

Sec. 6. (a) The Kansas department of agriculture, Kansas department of wildlife, parks and tourism, Kansas water office, state board of veterinary examiners, state historical society, state library and state fair board shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.

- (b) The Kansas department for aging and disability services, Kansas department for children and families, Kansas commission on veterans' affairs office, Kansas guardianship program, behavioral sciences regulatory board, Kansas state school for the blind and the Kansas state school for the deaf shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (c) The department of administration, office of information technology services, office of administrative hearings, insurance department, Kansas public employees' retirement system and the state treasurer shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (d) The department of commerce, Kansas housing resources corporation, board of accountancy, state bank commissioner and the state department of credit unions shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (e) The department of corrections, state board of indigents' defense services, judicial council, Kansas sentencing commission, Kansas human rights commission and the emergency medical services board shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (f) The Kansas department of health and environment, board of nursing, Kansas dental board, state board of healing arts, health care stabilization fund board of governors, Kansas board of examiners in fitting and dispensing of hearing instruments and the board of examiners in optometry shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (g) The department of labor, state board of mortuary arts, state board of technical professions, state board of pharmacy, Kansas board of barbering and the Kansas state board of cosmetology shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (h) The department of revenue, state board of tax appeals, office of the securities commissioner of Kansas, abstracters' board of examiners,

 real estate appraisal board and the Kansas real estate commission shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.

- (i) The department of transportation, citizens' utility ratepayer board, state corporation commission, department of education, governmental ethics commission, Kansas lottery and the Kansas racing and gaming commission shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- (j) The adjutant general, Kansas highway patrol, Kansas bureau of investigation, state fire marshal and the Kansas commission on peace officers' standards and training shall submit a zero-based budget proposal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2027, and shall be subject to zero-based budget review each 10 years thereafter.
- Sec. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
