## SENATE BILL No. 399

AN ACT concerning state governmental ethics; dealing with lobbyists;
 amending K.S.A. 46-237 and repealing the existing section.

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4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

5 Section 1. K.S.A. 46-237 is hereby amended to read as follows: 46-237. (a) Except as provided by this section, no state officer or employee, 6 7 candidate for state office or state officer elect shall accept, or agree to accept any: (1) Economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, 8 9 favor, hospitality or service having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in 10 any calendar year; or (2) hospitality in the form of recreation having an 11 aggregate value of \$100 or more in any calendar year from any one person 12 known to have a special interest, under circumstances where such person 13 knows or should know that a major purpose of the donor is to influence 14 such person in the performance of their official duties or prospective 15 official duties.

16 (b) Except as provided by this section, no person with a special interest shall offer, pay, give or make any: (1) Economic opportunity, gift, 17 loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality or service having an 18 aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year; or (2) hospitality in 19 20 the form of recreation having an aggregate value of \$100 or more in any 21 calendar year to any state officer or employee, candidate for state office or 22 state officer elect with a major purpose of influencing such officer or 23 employee, candidate for state office or state officer elect in the 24 performance of official duties or prospective official duties.

(c) No person licensed, inspected or regulated by a state agency shall offer, pay, give or make any economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality or service having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year to such agency or any state officer or employee, candidate for state office or state officer elect of that agency.

30 (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), hospitality in the form of 31 food and beverages is presumed not to be given to influence a state officer 32 or employee, candidate for state office or state officer elect in the 33 performance of official duties or prospective official duties, except when a 34 particular course of official action is to be followed as a condition thereon.

No lobbyist shall provide to a member of the state legislature any
 tickets to an event for which there is a charge for attending such event or

1 pay for or otherwise furnish any meal unless the meal or the event is part

2 of an event open to all members of the legislature and no member is
3 required to pay for attending such event.

4 (e) Except when a particular course of official action is to be followed 5 as a condition thereon, this section shall not apply to: (1) Any contribution 6 reported in compliance with the campaign finance act; or (2) a 7 commercially reasonable loan or other commercial transaction in the 8 ordinary course of business.

9 (f) No state officer or employee shall accept any payment of 10 honoraria for any speaking engagement except that a member of the state legislature or a part-time officer or employee of the executive branch of 11 government shall be allowed to receive reimbursement in the preparation 12 for and the making of a presentation at a speaking engagement in an 13 amount fixed by the commission prior to the acceptance of the speaking 14 15 engagement. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the 16 reimbursement of state officers and employees for reasonable expenses 17 incurred in attending seminars, conferences and other speaking 18 engagements.

(g) The provisions of this section shall not be applicable to or prohibit
the acceptance of gifts from governmental agencies of foreign nations,
except that any gift accepted from such foreign governmental agency,
having an aggregate value of \$100 or more, shall be accepted on behalf of
the state of Kansas.

24 (h) No legislator shall solicit any contribution to be made to any 25 organization for the purpose of paving for travel, subsistence and other expenses incurred by such legislator or other members of the legislature in 26 27 attending and participating in meetings, programs and activities of such 28 organization or those conducted or sponsored by such organization, but 29 nothing in this act or the act of which this act is amendatory shall be 30 construed to prohibit any legislator from accepting reimbursement for 31 actual expenses for travel, subsistence, hospitality, entertainment and other 32 expenses incurred in attending and participating in meetings, programs and 33 activities sponsored by the government of any foreign nation, or any 34 organization organized under the laws of such foreign nation or any 35 international organization or any national, nonprofit, nonpartisan 36 organization established for the purpose of serving, informing, educating 37 and strengthening state legislatures in all states of the nation, when paid 38 from funds of such organization and nothing shall be construed to limit or 39 prohibit the expenditure of funds of and by any such organization for such 40 purposes.

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Sec. 2. K.S.A. 46-237 is hereby repealed.
