SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2111

As Recommended by House Committee on Judiciary

Brief*

HB 2111 would amend the statute governing which items may be included in the taxation of court costs to include convenience fees and other administrative fees levied for the privilege of paying assessments, fees, costs, fines, or forfeitures by credit card or other means, including, but not limited to, fees for electronic filing of documents or pleadings with the court.

Background

In the House Judiciary Committee, a representative of the Kansas Credit Attorney Association appeared in support of the bill, explaining the purpose of the bill is to clarify payment transaction fees of four percent charged to parties for credit card payments of court fees is taxable as a cost. Representatives of Credit Management Services and the Kansas Bar Association also submitted written proponent testimony.

No neutral or opponent testimony was provided.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget indicates the bill would have no fiscal effect on the Judicial Branch.
