SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 313

As Recommended by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

Brief*

SB 313 would amend provisions in the Legislative Post Audit Act governing the reporting process for information technology audits performed by the Legislative Division of Post Audit. Under the bill, the Division would no longer be required to provide written reports of such audits to the Governor and all three chief information technology officers, but rather to the chief information technology officer of the branch of government to which the audited entity belongs.

Background

The bill was introduced by the Legislative Post Audit Committee. In the Senate Committee, the Legislative Post Auditor testified in support of the bill noting the proposed bill would limit the distribution of confidential information technology security audits to the agency, appropriate branch chief information technology officer, the Legislative Post Audit Committee, and the Joint Committee on Information Technology.

The Senate Committee recommended the bill be passed and be placed on the Consent Calendar.

There was no fiscal note available at the time of the Senate Committee hearing.
