NOW on this 17 day of ANNARY , 1995, comes on for hearing the defendant's motion for the return of property. The State of Kansas appears by and through Christopher L. Schneider, Assistant District Attorney. The defendant appears by and through her attorney, Jay H. Vaderi

After hearing the arguments of counsel and being well and fully advised in the premises the Court sustains said motion.

IT IS THEREFORE BY THIS COURT ORDERED that the Highway Patrol or any other law enforcement agency that has possession of the currency siezed from the defendant as a result of her arrest on August 24. 1995, be returned to the defendant by and through her attorney.
