However, due to youthful indiscretions that resulted in a misdemeanor charge being on their record, those individuals will not allowed to be hired.

On behalf of the KAAAC, we would like to encourage your committee to consider any necessary modifications to the current statues and or laws that could remedy this and create opportunities that are now closed. We are not advocating that minimum qualifications standards be lowered nor watered down. However, rather a simple modification that lends itself the latitude to attract additional men and women to apply.

This action, in our opinion, would open up the career doors of Law Enforcement to those qualified candidates desiring to serve and who otherwise would be hired were it not for the misdemeanor charge (committed and convicted as a juvenile under the age of 18) on their records.
