Good morning, Bob.

At the conclusion of the February 6th hearing on HB 2565, Chairman Jennings requested the KBI determine if we maintain a "meter count" on the Offender Registration website and asked that we produce data showing the number of "hits" that occur annually on all registries, in addition to the number of hits annually, specific to drug offenders.

Our IT department has tried diligently to get this information from the system; unfortunately, they system does not enable us to produce the level of detail the Chairman requested. When one visits the website, it automatically defaults to search for all offender types within the search parameters (name, geographical, etc.) While a visitor could manually uncheck sex and violent offender types and only search for drug offenders, we are unable to produce data showing to what extent visitors search all, or specifically how many search for only drug offenders.

What we are able to provide is how many unique visitors the site received and how many page views resulted in 2017.

\*Our IT Department upgraded security of the system at the beginning of December and went to a reverse proxy, which makes it look like we had only one unique visitor. Unfortunately we are unable to provide the number of unique visitors in December without a great deal of manual effort. As such, the total number of unique visitors in 2017 is absent one month of data but the trends appear steady so that number would easily exceed 3.6 million in 2017.

Additionally, Rep. Highberger asked a couple of the conferees if there was any data suggesting drug offenders reoffend. We were able to determine that out of the 4555 drug offenders currently on the registry, 294 of them committed an additional drug crime that also required registration after their first drug registration.
