Dear Chairman John Barker and the members of the House Committee on Federal and State Affairs:

I OPPOSE House Bill HB2220.

As an educator, I am very much opposed to legislation that prevents universities and colleges from enacting regulations to control firearms on campuses.

Because of the high concentration of young adults on college campuses (many of whom are free of parental restraints for the first time or still have not matured sufficiently), and the stress they are under to succeed, colleges and universities need to have that control over weapons on campus.
