1 AN ACT concerning health care; relating to palliative care; establishing
2 the palliative care and quality of life interdisciplinary advisory council;
3 palliative care consumer and professional information and education
4 program.

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 Section 1. (a) There is hereby created the palliative care and quality
8 of life interdisciplinary advisory council within the department of health
9 and environment. The purpose of this council is to develop
10 recommendations and advise the department of health and environment on
11 matters related to the establishment, maintenance, operation, outcomes
12 evaluation of palliative care initiatives in the state, and effectiveness of the
13 palliative care consumer and professional information and education
14 program.

15 (b) (1) The palliative care and quality of life interdisciplinary
16 advisory council shall consist of 12 members appointed on or before
17 October 1, 2017. The members shall be appointed as follows: (A) Two
18 members appointed by the governor; (B) two members appointed by the
19 speaker of the house of representatives; (C) one member appointed by the
20 minority leader of the house of representatives; (D) two members
21 appointed by the president of the senate; (E) one member appointed by the
22 minority leader of the senate; (F) one member appointed by the secretary
23 of health and environment who shall represent the department of health
24 and environment; (G) one member appointed by the secretary for aging
25 and disability services who shall represent the department for aging and
26 disability services; (H) one member of the house committee on health and
27 human services appointed by the chair of the house committee on health
28 and human services; and (I) one member of the senate committee on
29 public health and welfare appointed by the chair of the senate committee
30 on public health and welfare.

31 (2) Members of the palliative care and quality of life interdisciplinary
32 advisory council shall be individuals with expertise and expertise in
33 interdisciplinary palliative care medical, nursing, social work, pharmacy
34 and spiritual guidance. Membership shall specifically include health care
35 professionals having palliative care work experience or expertise in
36 palliative care delivery models in a variety of inpatient, outpatient and

1 community settings and with a variety of populations including pediatric,
2 youth and adults. At least two members of the palliative care and quality of
3 life interdisciplinary advisory council shall be board-certified hospice and
4 palliative medicine physicians or nurses.

5 (3) Members of the palliative care and quality of life interdisciplinary
6 advisory council shall serve for a period of three years and shall serve at
7 the pleasure of their respective appointing authorities. The members shall
8 elect a chair and vice chair whose duties shall be established by the
9 council. The department of health and environment shall fix a time and
10 place for regular meetings of the council, which shall meet at least twice
11 annually.

12 (4) Members of the palliative care and quality of life
13 interdisciplinary advisory council shall serve without compensation, but
14 shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the
15 performance of their duties.

16 Sec. 2. (a) There is hereby created the state palliative care consumer
17 and professional information and education program in the department of
18 health and environment. The purpose of the state palliative care consumer
19 and professional information and education program is to maximize the
20 effectiveness of palliative care initiatives in the state by ensuring that
21 comprehensive and accurate information and education about palliative
22 care is available to the public, health care providers and health care
23 facilities.

24 (b) The department of health and environment:

25 (1) Shall publish information and resources on its website, including
26 links to external resources, about palliative care for the public, health care
27 providers and health care facilities. The information shall include, but not
28 be limited to, the following:

29 (A) Continuing education opportunities for health care providers;

30 (B) information about palliative care delivery in home, primary,
31 secondary and tertiary environments; and

32 (C) consumer educational materials and referral information for
33 palliative care, including hospice;

34 (2) may develop and implement any other initiatives regarding
35 palliative care services and education that it determines would further the
36 purposes of this section; and

37 (3) shall consult with the palliative care and quality of life
38 interdisciplinary advisory council.

(c) "Palliative care" means an approach that improves the
quality of life of patients and their families facing the problem
associated with life-threatening illness, through the prevention and
relief of suffering by means of early identification and impeccable
assessment and treatment of pain and other problems, physical,
psychosocial and spiritual. Palliative care:

- (1) Provides relief from pain and other distressing symptoms;
- (2) affirms life and regards dying as a normal process;
- (3) intends neither to hasten or postpone death;
- (4) integrates the psychological and spiritual aspects of patient
care;

(5) offers a support system to help patients live as actively as
possible until death;

(6) offers a support system to help the family cope during the
patient's illness and in their own bereavement;

(7) uses a team approach to address the needs of patients and
their families, including bereavement counseling, if indicated;

(8) will enhance quality of life, and may also positively influence
the course of illness; and

(9) is applicable early in the course of illness, in conjunction with
other therapies that are intended to prolong life, such as
chemotherapy or radiation therapy, and includes those investigations
needed to better understand and manage distressing clinical
complications.

(c) "Palliative care" shall have the meaning
ascribed to it in section 1, and amendments thereto.
