RE: Tax Exempt Status of the Kansas DUI Impact Center 2017 SB 140 (Support)

We have represented over 2,000 Kansans from all corners of the state whose lives have been changed by an automobile collision that was NOT their fault. Someone else chose to drive drunk, run a red light or speed into oncoming traffic, and our clients/your voters suffer. Not only does the collision injure them physically, but it also often leads to financial ruin and require reliance on social welfare programs.

<u>Drinking and Driving is a problem for everyone</u>. On average, a drunk driver will drive 80 times under the influence before their first arrest. Traffic collisions are leading cause of death for American Teens and roughly 1/3 of these collision involve alcohol or drugs. I regularly meet people whose lives have been affected by impaired drivers.

We all know impaired driving is a problem. However, the Kansas DUI Impact Center is doing something about this problem. I know how important the Kansas DUI Impact Center is because my clients use their services. My clients have turned to the DUI impact center for grief counseling and assistance in healing emotionally.
